The letter makes clear that as CIA policy, established by Director Brennan in August 2013, the CIA will make no operational use of vaccination programs, which includes vaccination workers. Similarly, the Agency will not seek to obtain or exploit DNA or other genetic material acquired through such programs. This policy applies worldwide, and to US persons and non-US persons alike Aber letter says, the Administration fully supports this policy, which demonstrates our support for global health and our continued commitment to the global eradication of polio.
