Dear General Chamberlin,

On September 24th you wrote me regarding the impending visit of Major Hartel in charge of the Special Document Section. Major Hartel has created a very favorable impression here with the Document Section of General Strong's organization and has gotten down to work with the "pick and shovel" boys in surveying the American and British documents problem. I believe the conclusions he has reached are sound and that you may depend on the facts he presents.

When I presented Major Hartel, General Strong assured me, as he has done on previous and subsequent occasions, that anything his agency had would be placed at our disposal. I am very sure that he is sincere and that he will fully support this position. It is suggested that General Vandenburg be informed of my conviction. I have known Strong for several years and am positive he can be depended upon.
