Director's Meeting

Thursday, 7 June 1951

The Director inquired into the possibility of getting [redacted] permanently. Mr. Dulles said that he thought it advisable not to push this issue at the present time. He pointed out that [redacted] had resigned from the Committee for Free Europe.

There was discussion of the problem of censorship and it was agreed that if this could be done on an unofficial basis it might provide valuable information.

Mr. Dulles reported that he had discussed a paper on electromagnetic warfare with Mr. Craig. The Director said that we should not ask to do this job but should request some other agency to take it on.

Mr. Dulles inquired as to the status of our ceiling on military personnel. The Director asked Mr. Wolf to discuss this matter with Mrs. Rosenberg.

Mr. Dulles reported that he was meeting with [redacted] and the Assistant Directors to discuss the relations of Secret Services with SHAPE.

It was reported that the NSC had asked for CIA comment on the ICIS paper on Soviet capabilities against the U.S. The Director said that in our reply we should point out that this was a joint operational intelligence estimate and that such a study could not be prepared unless the Department of Defense was ready to furnish us with appropriate information on U.S. defensive capabilities.

It was reported that Fisher Howe had called and asked whether we had received Gen. Wedemeyer's report and was informed that we hadn't. Howe also said that there was no immediate urgency on CIA's assisting them on their budget.

It was reported that General Bolling had recommended that an ad hoc committee of the IAC study the problem of relations in the field.

Mr. Wolf reported that a new agreement had been reached with C.A.T.
