Mr. Dulles reported on a meeting yesterday with Mr. Harriman, Gordon Gray, ECA and State in regard to Communist activities in Italy and France. There was general agreement that something should be done immediately. Mr. Dulles will probably discuss this with Ambassadors Bruce and Dunn on his trip abroad. State Department will probably send messages to Bruce and Dunn advising them of such discussions. Mr. Dulles suggested that the matter also be discussed with General Eisenhower and stated that while in Italy he would probably talk to De Gasperi or Macharti.

Mr. Dulles reported that he talked with Gen. Willoughby whose health seems to be fairly good. The Director stated that Willoughby had better get over [Redacted] immediately.
