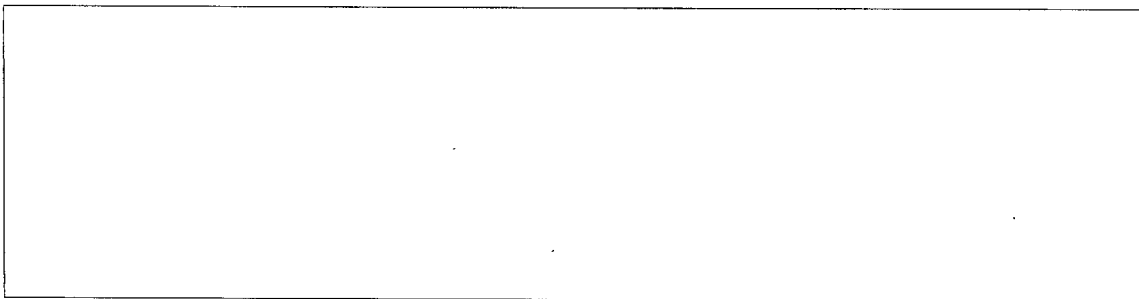

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Mr. Jackson reported that he had spoken to [redacted] about the possibility of his being a consultant. Krock does not feel he can do this on a formal paid basis. We may, therefore, consult him informally from time to time.

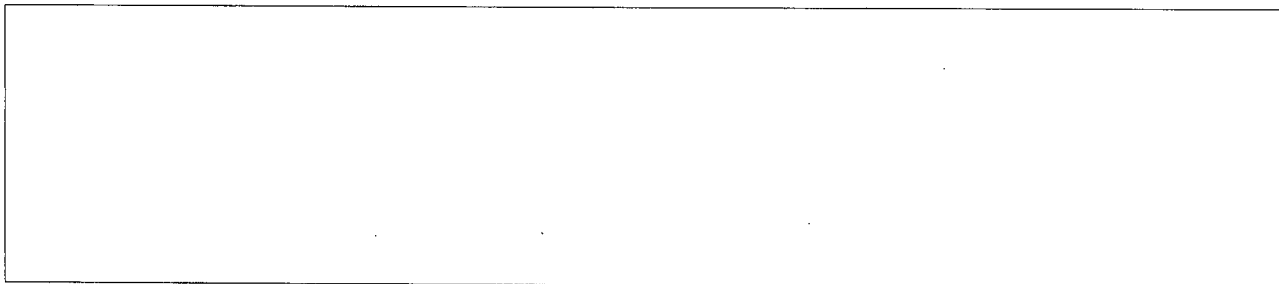
The DCI stated that Mr. Stassen would be here Friday afternoon.

Mr. Wisner suggested letters should be written for the DCI's signature to [redacted] who is returning from the Philippines, and to [redacted] who is taking his place. The DCI agreed to write [redacted]. Mr. Wisner will prepare a letter.



The DCI stated that among other things Ambassador Pauli has been favorably impressed with CIA personnel overseas. Mr. Wisner would like to play along with Ambassador Pauli at arms length and be on the receiving end of ideas.

The DCI stated that General Willoughby will be here on Friday. Mr. Wisner is to have the appropriate Far East people standing by.



The DCI thinks that [redacted] still has possibilities and hates to wash him out. However, he must be taught guerrilla warfare. Mr. Wisner stated that State Department is still restive about this operation and that Mr. Rusk would like our effort to be concentrated from areas that are not so sensitive. Wisner reassured Rusk on this point. The DCI

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thinks we should not help further until [redacted]

[redacted] First of all, we should get our people out and confer with Mr. Wisner will follow this and confer further with State Department.

Mr. Wisner stated that the matter of assistance to the Third Force is all up in the air. State Department is of a divided mind. The DCI believes that the Third Force must be kept alive but that this is a political decision for State Department. Mr. Wisner will follow this.



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
