HR70-14 brought to the attention of those present the 'necessity for first checking with the Director prior to firmly committing him to any appointments either here or outside the Agency. Mr. Reber reported that in his opinion the meeting of the Interdepartmental Priorities Committee, held on Monday, 27 August, was most successful. The main issue concerned how soon contributions and/or requirements could be furnished in order that a determination might be made as to collection priorities. Mr. Reber noted that both G-2 and the Navy were fully cooperating, and that G-2 was taking the lead in making helpful suggestions on this problem. Mr. Reber also indicated that after all requirements were received the Committee would then determine: (a) What, in fact, was required and needed; and (b) The priority of the geographic areas involved.
