The DCI called attention to an analysis of personnel turnover rate within CIA by offices. He commented that the rate was too high and to spotty. It should not average above 5 per cent. The DCI desires CIA to be extremely selective in choosing employees and to obtain, if possible, some assurance that they will serve a minimum of 3 years. Mr. Wolf undertook to follow through and to have an analysis of these figures made by General Davison.
