Noted that the SEA paper which was to have been discussed by the NSC Senior Staff had not yet been taken up.

## Col. Hansen:

a. Reported that he was going to New York this afternoon with Mr. Karamessines for a conference with the TIME-LIFE people and the CBS on the Greek trials.
b. Noted that DCI presentation before Congressional committees on the CIA budget wrould require support and noted the great effectiveness of discussing individual projects of a somewhat spectacular character. Mr. Earman suggested that Col. Hansen work with DD/A and with Mr. Davidson in order to prepare "gadgets" winich might be shown to the members of Congress in support of CIA's case. It was observed that the personnel ceiling directed by the DCI is not a pertinent factor in connection with the budget presentation
is not to be reflected in CIA budgetary renuirements.

Mr. Dines:
a. Reported that the study of indications required by the IAC was being discussed with $D D / I$. All the offices concerned have agreed that research in depth should be undertaken on certain of the indications. The principal problem appears to be who is to do the research and who is to coordinate.
b. Reported that the NSCID on FDD was again active. He had conferred with $A D / 00$ yesterday and, on the basis of the latter's agreement on a draft NSCID, was planning to approach the other agencies beginning the first of next week. It is not expected that the NSCID would be placed before the IAC for at least a month.

## Mr. Harvey:

Reported that the group will be meeting on the 20th and 21st of this month and that all arrangements were being made. Mr. Earman noted that Dr . Sontag had recommended a new man for the $\square$ group as a substitute for Kennan. Because of the short time between now and the meeting, the security clearance of the substitu e must be expedited. Mr. Harvey undertook to check the point.
