PRESENT: General Smith (part of the meeting), Messrs. Dulles, Wisner, Wolf, Amory, Col. Betts, Mr. Earman

General Smith:

a. Noted a cable from [redacted] and asked Mr. Wisner to prepare a reply which would include (1) our conversations with Ambassador Briggs; (2) instructions to the Senior Representative, [redacted] to contact Briggs immediately upon his arrival. *Dene*

Mr. Dulles:

b. Noted that Mr. Harry Rosenfield of the President's Commission on Immigration had asked to see the Director on Saturday, 15 November, and stated that (1) he did not believe we should become involved with the Commission's proposed changes in the McCarran bill; (2) we had already noted our position, which was neutral, in a letter to the Bureau of the Budget. This matter was discussed with the Director upon his arrival at the meeting and he asked Mr. Earman to call Mr. Rosenfield to advise him that he would be out of town on Saturday. Mr. Dulles also noted that Adm. Kirk had agreed to talk to Mr. Rosenfield and his Committee. The Director said he would discuss this with Kirk at today's PSB luncheon. *Dene*

d. Asked Mr. Amory the status of the document being prepared on Stalin's speech. Mr. Amory replied that this was being done by [redacted] and it was his understanding that it was already in their hands. After some discussion, Mr. Dulles asked that Mr. Amory furnish him about 6 copies of the [redacted] comments on this subject.
