Mr. Dulles:

a. Noted the item in today's Log regarding an approach by a group of Americans in Paris purporting to represent "industrial circles" and "the Republican hierarchy" to Polish members of the PPS and [redacted] and, after some discussion, undertook to advise Mr. John Foster Dulles of this incident. Mr. Wisner asked if Mr. John Foster Dulles was contacted in regard to an appointment with a [redacted] representative we be advised.

b. Noted that [redacted] with the approval of the DCI, had gone abroad on a short trip and undertook to discuss the nature of this visit with Mr. Amory at a future date.

c. Asked that a meeting on our maritime program be arranged for 11 a.m. Tuesday, 9 December. Mr. Earman undertook to do this.

d. Raised the question of CIA being represented at the [redacted]

these conferences, undertook to raise this matter with the Director at tomorrow's Deputies' Meeting.

e. Noted a cable from the Senior Representative, [redacted] and asked DD/P to prepare an appropriate reply.

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Mr. Dulles (Cont'd.)

Mr. Wisner:

a. Noted, in response to a query from Mr. Dulles, that we were pressing forward in our preparations for the committee to be appointed to investigate psychological warfare activities. In this connection, Mr. Dulles asked DD/P for a report as to the restrictions placed

Mr. Wisner stated we were already taking advantage of this and undertook to prepare a current report for D/DCI.

d. Raised the question of a briefing by CIA for Admiral Espe, the newly appointed Director of Naval Intelligence. Mr. Earman undertook to raise this with the Director.

Mr. Amory referred to a cable regarding a possible coup in and stated this appeared to be "much ado about nothing".

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
