

Mr. Amory:

- a. Reported he had received a call from Gen. Partridge requesting that Lt. Col. William C. Lantaff, a reserve officer on active duty with G-2, be allowed to attend the IAC meeting on 11 December. Mr. Amory went on to note that Lantaff in civilian life was a member of Congress. The Director stated that (1) he had noted that the attendance at recent IAC meetings was increasing; (2) it had been agreed that no one would attend these meetings unless his presence was essential in connection with papers to be discussed; (3) if the possibility of Lantaff's attendance at this meeting had already been mentioned to him he would approve an exception in this instance; (4) Mr. Amory would bring the above to the attention of Gen. Partridge.
- b. Noted that the heads of the several ORR consultants panels would be in Washington for the next few days for a series of conferences and invited the Director and the Deputy Director to attend any of these meetings.
- c. Reported that a briefing had been arranged for Admiral Espe on 22 December to cover both sides of the Agency and he would be the host. Mr. Wisner asked Mr. Amory to advise Admiral Espe if he required any further information on our covert activities he would be glad to make himself available for this purpose.
