

#### **PREFACE**

This report is one in a series on Soviet Ground Force and logistic installations being prepared for a DIA/CIA Panel. The series is being coordinated, published and disseminated by NPIC. The photographic analysis is being performed by the NPIC Photographic Analysis Group, the CIA Photographic Intelligence Division (NPIC), and the Production Center 1P1c (DIA). The photographic analysis for this particular report was performed by the NPIC Photographic Analysis Group.

In the interest of uniformity, the titles and letter designators for the facilities observed at these installations are identical with those appearing in the project requirement. When a specific facility is not observed both its title and letter designator are omitted in the report.

Titles and letter designators for the various facilities are as follows: (A) railroad service, (B) road service, (C) landing strips, (D) administrative and troop housing areas, (E) storage areas, (F) ammunition storage areas, (G) POL storage areas, (H) other buildings and facilities, (J) equipment storage/maintenance areas, (K) athletic fields, (L) small arms firing ranges, (M) driver training areas, (N) tank/assault gun firing ranges, (P) flat trajectory firing ranges, (Q) artillery emplacements (batteries), (R) infantry or combined arms field training area or courses, (S) special training facilities, (T) unidentified facilities or tracking activity.




FIGURE 1. LOCATION OF POSSIBLE MILITARY STORAGE AREA, DZERZHINSK.

#### SUMMARY

A possible military storage area (Figure 1) is located on the northeast edge of Dzerzhinsk (53-41N 027-08E). This installation is identified in the Bombing Encyclopedia as Dzerzhinsk Army Barracks Northeast AL-1). No barracks are identified in this installation. The area is served by the primary Dzerzhinsk-Minsk highway. Dzerzhinsk Army Barracks Southeast is located 6.6 kilometers (km) southeast.




FIGURE 2. POSSIBLE MILITARY STORAGE AREA, DZERZHINSK, USSR, FEBRUARY 1964.




FIGURE 3. POSSIBLE MILITARY STORAGE AREA, DZERZHINSK. Sketch compiled from February 1964.

This secured installation covers approxi-

mately 25 acres and contains 12 storage buildings and 19 support buildings (Figures 2 and 3).

The installation was covered by 1956 TALENT photography and four KEYHOLE missions between June 1962 and February 1964. Comparative analysis reveals the same general level of usage between June 1962 and February 1964. Significant changes since 1956 include a small expansion in area and the addition of five storage and two support buildings.

#### DESCRIPTION OF INSTALLATION

#### Railroad Service

The area is not directly rail served; however, the main Minsk-Baranovichi rail line serves Dzerzhinsk.

#### Road Service

The Dzerzhinsk-Minsk highway passes on the south edge of the installation.

#### General Storage Area

Area E, secured, contains 12 storage buildings and 19 support buildings, all apparently occupied. Five of the storage buildings and two of the support buildings have been added since 1956.
