

PREFACE

This report is one in a series on Soviet Ground Force and Logistic installations being prepared for a DIA/CIA Panel. The series is being coordinated, published and disseminated by NPIC. The photographic analysis is being performed by the NPIC Photographic Analysis Group, the CIA Photographic Intelligence Division (NPIC), and the Production Center 1P1a (DIA). The photographic analysis for this particular report was performed by the Production Center 1P1a.

In the interest of uniformity, the titles and letter designators for the facilities observed at these installations are identical with those appearing in the project requirement. When a specific facility is not observed both its title and letter designator are omitted in the report.

Titles and letter designators for the various facilities are as follows: (A) railroad service, (B) road service, (C) landing strips, (D) administrative and troop housing areas, (E) storage areas, (F) ammunition storage areas, (G) POL storage areas, (II) other buildings and facilities, (J) equipment storage/maintenance areas, (K) athletic fields, (L) small arms firing ranges, (M) driver training areas, (N) tank/assault gun firing ranges, (P) flat trajectory firing ranges, (Q) artillery emplacements (batteries), (R) infantry or combined arms field training areas or courses, (S) special training facilities, (T) unidentified facilities or tracking activity.




FIGURE 1. LOCATION OF CHERNYAKHOVSK ARMY BARRACKS NORTH.

Chernyakhovsk Army Barracks North is located on the northeast of a Chernyakhovsk army Barracks Horstenau III, 2.1 kilometers (km) north (Figure 1).

The barracks area covers 185 acres and contains barracks, administration buildings, support buildings, vehicle maintenance/storage

buildings, an athletic field and 2 large driverlealning arous (Digmons 2 and 2).

This installation is active and was unchanged on 7 KEYHOLE missions between November 1962 and June 1964. However, increasing improvement in the quality of photography shows buildings which are not new but could not be identified on earlier photography.

DESCRIPTION OF INSTALLATION

Railroad Service

The installation is possibly served by a spur from the Chernyakhovsk-Sovetsk Railway.

Road Service

The installation is served by a good all-weather road.

Administration and Troop Housing Areas

Area D1 contains 15 multistory barracks/administration buildings, 2 administration buildings, 3 storage buildings, and 4 support buildings.

Area D2 contains 4 barracks buildings, 2 administration buildings, 6 storage buildings, 25 support buildings, one 165- by 60-foot vehicle maintenance building, and two 210- by 35-foot vehicle storage buildings.

General Storage Area

Area E contains 3 storage buildings and 5 support buildings.

Equipment Storage/Maintenance Areas

Area J1 contains 7 support buildings, 5 storage buildings, one 705- by 75-foot vehicle storage building, one 340- by 75-foot vehicle

storage building, one 217- by 45-foot vehicle maintenance building, one 150- by 45-foot vehicle maintenance building, and one 277- by 60-foot vehicle maintenance building.

Area J2 contains 2 support buildings, two 150- by 45-foot vehicle storage buildings, two 210- by 65-foot vehicle storage buildings, five 225- by 50-foot vehicle storage buildings, one 195- by 60-foot vehicle storage building, and one 225- by 75-foot vehicle storage building.

Athletic Field

Area K is an athletic field with 2 unidentified buildings.

Driver-Training Areas

Area M1 contains a wheeled-vehicle drivertraining course which is abandoned, but could be reactivated in an emergency.

Area M2 contains a wheeled-vehicle drivertraining course, 1 support building, two 360by 60-foot vehicle storage buildings, and one 225- by 60-foot vehicle storage building.

Area M3 contains atracked-vehicle driver-training course.

Areas M2 and 3 show heavy track activity.




FIGURE 3. CHERNYAKHOVSK ARMY BARRACKS NORTH. Sketch compiled from
