Mr. Bannerman:
Larry Houston and I met on
this paper this afternoon with special reference to your concerns
about paragraphs 13 and 14. felt that his paper, which he didn't
write, probably had too much philosophy in it and that essentially all
he wanted to say was that Air America should not interfere with CASI's
negotiations for political reasons and that CASI should be encouraged to
stay in Vietnam as an alternate air support facility. He understands
your point that Air America is attempting to establish a non-Agency
affiliated program in Vietnam for the long haul and thinks this is good.

The memorandum, in my opinion, is not reflective of attitude which seems to me quite reasonable. He agrees that it would not be a good idea at all for CASI/Air Vietnam to be the sole air support facility; in other words to have a monopoly.
