PIC observed a world Airways aircraft on base legawhen the rocket impacted. World trways aborted and departed the area.

WT 3243 Cambodia Capt. GREENWAY reports that on * three separate occasions mortar fire impacted in the vicinity of the Landing Zone at Neak Luong (C48) while his aircraft was on the approach or just after landing * No personnel injuries or aircraft * damage involved.

WT 0864 Cambodia Acft was enroute from Phnom Penh to Neak Luong (C48), Cambodia, when \$10 observed a flash and smoke from an impacting round of DK82 fire. Capt. GREENWAY reports this projectile was targeted at his aircraft. No personnel injuries or aircraft damage involved.
