MISSIONARIES WITH HEROIN

"The Politics of Heroin in Southeast Asia" on its publication in New York created utter consternation in the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency. Alfred McCoy, the author of the book, has disclosed facts hitherto carefully concealed from the American public. And these facts do not correspond in the slightest to the myth created by bourgeois propaganda of the CIA's "special mission" in Indochina to save the Asian peoples from an illusory "Communist menace."

As it has now come to be known, this is not the first month that American intelligence has been combining its espionage activities in the countries of Southeast Asia with... smuggling narcotics.

Many American diplomats, McCoy asserts, are also actively taking part in the CIA's shady affairs with profit to themselves.
