MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Donation of C-45 Beechcraft to U.S. Marine Corps Museum

- 1. Attached is a letter to Air America from the Assistant Deputy Director for Marine Corps Museum requesting Air America to donate a C-45 Beechcraft to the Marine Corps Museum at Quantico, Virginia.
- 2. The aircraft in question is currently located at Tainan. It has never been modified or upgraded and it would cost Air America more to return it to the U. S. then it is worth. Air America had planned to sell it for scrap. When the Marine Corps heard about this aircraft, they asked Air America if they could acquire the aircraft. As stated in the letter, they will pick it up and return it to the U. S. at their expense.
- 3. This particular letter was available at the time when Mr. Walter Rowen of GSA was visiting Air America to look over possible surplus aircraft which might be taken over by GSA. He was asked whether GSA would have any objection to Air America giving the aircraft to the Marine Corps Museum. He indicated that they would have no objections since the aircraft was located overseas and was not a government registered aircraft. He added that GSA had recently given surplus aircraft to the Marine Corps Museum.
- 4. I then discussed this proposal with the DDA pointing out that Air America would receive little in scrap value for the aircraft, that in my opinion, that it was in the best interest of the U. S. Government to donate the aircraft to the Marine Corps Museum. He concurred, subject to the concurrence of the General Counsel. Mr. of OGC was then contacted on the matter and he concurred in such a transfer.
