SUMMARY:

This report is a translation of a Russian-language document entitled "Operational Mission--Situation as of 1700 hours 4 April," issued to the Polish General Staff, and classified TOP SECRET. The training exercise situation report gives a scenario for a NATO-Warsaw Pact confrontation with intelligence input on both sides. The scenario presents an increased military threat by NATO with cooperation from China and Japan. The Warsaw Pact counters the threat by going to full combat readiness. The exercise focuses on the detailed steps taken by the Polish Armed Forces to bring all units to a state of increased combat readiness. All unit commanders are to assess the situation report and be prepared to undertake operational missions. Appendix 10 gives NATO strength in the Western Theater of Military Operations. Appendix 7 is especially significant: it lists the availability of nuclear warheads for the Polish front, including a considerable number of 500-KT weapons.

GENERAL SITUATION

WEST, since the beginning of 1978, has undertaken a number of military political steps aimed at straining relations with the Soviet Union and the other Warsaw Pact countries and, under the guise of combat with left-wing forces, of exercises, and of measures to eliminate unemployment and inflation, has gradually set about the conversion of their countries and armed forces from peacetime to wartime status. The governments of the NATO countries have increased pressure on the nonaligned states to discontinue cooperation with the USSR and other socialist countries. Provocations and attacks on representatives of the socialist countries have grown more frequent in BONN, LONDON, NEW YORK, ROME, CAIRO, VIENNA, and PEKING.

Appearances of revanchist forces have increased in the Federal Republic of Germany (FRG). Since early March of this year, FRG government representatives have made demands for the reunification of Germany within prewar borders. Neofascist organizations in Italy have stepped up their activity. The ruling circles of Turkey and Greece have made territorial claims against Bulgaria.

In February of this year, an extraordinary session of the NATO Council was held in BRUSSELS at the level of heads of government. At the session, Spain was granted NATO membership and steps were also determined for closer cooperation within the framework of the military organization of the bloc. At closed sessions of the heads of government and ministers of defense, the procedure was determined for actions of bloc countries in case of war in Europe and measures were agreed on to increase the combat readiness of the armed forces. The government of Austria announced support of NATO policy.

At the beginning of March, the Nato Allied Armed Forces command began the conduct of a series of large national and combined exercises of the armed forces of the bloc in Europe and the Atlantic under the codename SPRING FORGE, in which the ground forces, air forces, and navy of Greece as well as France are taking part.

In the ground forces of the NATO countries, under the guise of exercises, covert measures are being carried out to bring the combat-ready large units and units of the first and second echelons up to strength as well as to mobilize new large units. The airlift and sealift of troops from the US, Great Britain, and Canada to European theaters of operations are being carried out.

In the NATO air forces, the grouping and combat readiness of aviation in the Central European and Southern European Theaters of Military Operations are being increased. Aircraft are being transferred from the US. Since 20 March, there have been noted flights of American strategic bombers with nuclear weapons on board. Throughout January to March of this year there has been an increase in the number of launches of US satellites: fivefold in reconnaissance satellites (SAMOS-M, LASP, and FERRET), twofold in communications satellites (DSCS-2 and MARISAT), and 30 percent in navigation satellites (TRANSIT). The number of means on alert in the NATO air defense system has increased. Airspace monitoring has been reinforced. There has been a growth in the intensity of operation of air target detection radar centers and posts.

Since mid-March, in violation of international legal procedure, WEST has been deliberately creating difficulties for maritime shipping of socialist countries. The Danish and Turkish powers, under pretext of the conduct of exercises and of the added danger of a possible collision of vessels, as of 1 April have announced a temporary ban on the passage of foreign warships through the zones of the Baltic and Black Sea Straits, respectively. The allied naval forces of NATO, under the pretext of preparation for combined exercises, are carrying out the deployment of forces to the areas of combat assignment. Work has begun to demothball forts and shore artillery in the zones of the Baltic and Black Sea Straits; and the patrol service in the zone of ports and naval bases has been reinforced, and so has the search and tracking of EAST's submarines.

Since mid-1977, in the NATO countries there has been noted a considerable buildup of military industry and an increase of production capacities to expand the output of combat equipment and armament. There has been noted a threefold increase in the output of aircraft in the US in February of this year and a three- to fourfold increase in the output of tanks in the FRG in comparison with February of 1977. Deliveries of heavy weapons, combat equipment, and technical materiel from the US, Great Britain, and Canada to the countries of the Central European and Southern European Theaters of Military Operations have grown.

The situation has sharply deteriorated in the Near East. The US has increased deliveries of armament and military equipment to the Arab Republic of Egypt. On the borders between the Arab Republic of Egypt and Libya and between Israel and Syria there are periodic armed encounters. Israel has seized the southern part of Lebanon.

SOUTH (China and Japan) has announced full support of the military political actions of WEST. China has increased anti-Soviet propanganda and is making territorial claims against the USSR, carrying out military preparations, and covertly transferring troops from the central and southern provinces to the borders of the USSR. Japanese government representatives are stepping up appearances with demands to annex the Kurile Islands to Japan.

EAST, the Warsaw Pact member states, is taking steps to normalize the situation in the world. Simultaneously, in response to the military preparations of WEST and SOUTH, it is covertly carrying out measures to increase the combat readiness of its armed forces.

In connection with the growing threat of aggression on the part of NATO, the Political Consultative Committee of the Warsaw Pact countries, on 30 March of this year, made the decision to establish, on the basis of the Staff of the Combined Armed Forces of the Warsaw Pact member states, High Commands of the Combined Armed Forces in the Western and Southwestern Theaters of Military Operations and to place in operational subordination to them the fronts allocated from the armed forces of the Warsaw Pact member states, with the introduction of FULL COMBAT READINESS. On the same day, the Policital Consultative Committee adopted the decision, in view of the threat of the start of war by WEST, to grant the General Headquarters of the Supreme High Command of the Armed Forces of the USSR the authority to direct the operations of the Combined Armed Forces of the Warsaw Pact member states with declaration of MILITARY THREAT combat readiness.

By 1100 hours 31 March of this year, EAST'S COMBINED ARMED FORCES were brought to INCREASED COMBAT READINESS.

1. EAST

The large units and units of the Polish Armed Forces have completed the performance of INCREASED COMBAT READINESS measures. The forces of the Navy of the Polish People's Republic have likewise been brought to INCREASED COMBAT READINESS and are at bases and areas of dispersal. Composition and position of the Polish Armed Forces and the Navy of the Polish People's Republic are in accordance with the initial situation map.)


Headquarters and staffs of all levels are implementing round-the-clock alert of command personnel. Prepared control posts have been made ready to control the troops and fleet forces while these are being brought to the subsequent levels of combat readiness.

The General Staff and Naval Staff are refining operational and mobilization documents, including plans for allocation from the Polish Armed Forces of the 3d Front and for transferring naval forces to the Combined Baltic Fleet. (Combat and numerical strength of the front and forces of the Navy of the Polish People's Republic are in accordance with the appendices.)

The on-alert forces and means of the Air Defense and Air Forces have gone over to the performance of duty with full combat crews.

The air defense large units and units of the Ground Forces are deployed at positions near the permanent garrison sites of the troops and have the on-alert subunits in Readiness No. 1, and the remaining subunits in Readiness No. 2.

The air regiments of the Air Forces of the Polish People's Republic are at the home airfields. Each regiment has placed on alert one squadron, in which two crews are in Readiness No. 2. Dispersal (operational) airfields have been made ready to receive air units and subunits. Advance teams and komendatury with reserves of ammunition, aviation fuel, and materiel have been brought into readiness to move to the dispersal airfields.

The Air Defense Forces of the Polish People's Republic, in cooperation with air defense forces and means of the Northern Group of Forces and the Baltic Fleet, are covering administrative and industrial centers, airfields, troops, and rear services installations against enemy air strikes.

Radar subunits of the radiotechnical troops, in cooperation with the radiotechnical subunits of the Northern Group of Forces, are conducting round-the-clock combat alert according to schedule.

The combat forces of the Navy of the Polish People's Republic, after replenishing reserves to full norms, have gone to alternate dispersal areas. Ships in repair and refitting are speeding up work for an accelerated return to service. The size of forces on alert has been reinforced, and patrols have been deployed at the approaches to bases.

The size of alert duty shifts has been reinforced in communications centers. Reserve and backup communications means are being made ready for operation. With permission of the General Staff, the takeover of additional communications channels from the state communications network of the Polish People's Republic is being carried out (according to previously coordinated lists).

The rear services of the Polish Armed Forces, carrying out the materiel and medical support of troops and naval forces, are conducting measures to build up forces and means. At stationary depots and bases, materiel is being readied for issue to the troops and for dispersal. At artillery depots, work is being completed to put ammunition into completely filled and fuzed form.

The large units and units of the Northern Group of Forces have been brought to INCREASED COMBAT READINESS at permanent garrisons and they are in readiness to move out on combat alert signal to concentration areas.

2. WEST

A state of military alert was introduced at the end of March among the allied armed forces of NATO in the European theaters of military operations and the zone of the Baltic In the FRG, the border guard regime is being reinforced on the border with the German Democratic Republic and the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic. Subunits of American troops continue to arrive in the ports of BREMERHAVEN and EMDEN and at the airfields of RAMSTEIN and SEMBACH; the landing of English troops has been noted in HAARLEM and THE HAGUE. Exercises are being conducted in the area 50 kilometers southeast of BREMEN by West German troops, in the area 20 kilometers south of HANNOVER by English troops, in the area 40 kilometers east of FRANKFURT AM MAIN by American troops, and in the area 30 kilometers west of AUGSBURG by newly activated units of the FRG. Preparation for the evacuation of population from the areas bordering on the German Democratic Republic and the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic has begun, and so has the partial dispersal of reserves of materiel in the zone of combat actions.

The activity of all types of reconnaissance has been stepped up. The allied armed forces headquarters for the Central European Theater of Military Operations has been transferred to the permanent wartime control post. In the period 30 March to 1 April, the number of checks of the systems for control of the nuclear forces on alert and of the mobile nuclear warheads storage points rose to eight times a day (instead of one or two). For communications, the systems of satellite, tropospheric, radio-relay, cable line, and radio communications of NATO and the national armed forces in the theaters of military operations have been activated.


WEST's allied air forces are continuing to build up the aviation grouping in the theater of military operations. Part of the forces and means of the 2d and 4th Allied Tactical Air Forces are participating in joint exercises with the ground forces in the areas of BREMEN, HANNOVER, FRANKFURT AM MAIN, and AUGSBURG. On the territories of the countries of the theater, the deployment of air technical units has been noted at airfields not previously occupied by combat aviation. American aircraft continue to arrive at the airfields of NORDHOLZ, LEEUWARDEN, LEIPHEIM, and BREMERGARTEN [sic, presumably BREMGARTEN]. The 17th Electronic Warfare Air Squadron was transferred from the US to the 17th Air Army on 31 March. Two to four delivery aircraft and four or five combat aircraft from each squadron are on combat alert in 15-minute combat readiness. Aerial reconnaissance is being conducted by reconnaissance aircraft and helicopters (six to The intensity of eight flights per day) along the border. flights of radio and radiotechnical reconnaissance aircraft has increased sharply beginning 30 March. Instances of violation of the airspace of the Warsaw Pact states by single aircraft have grown more frequent.

WEST's air defense forces and means have been brought to increased combat readiness; part of the Hawk surface-to-air guided missile subunits on the territory of the FRG have been relocated to the border areas under the guise of exercises. Two batteries of every Hawk and Nike Hercules surface-to-air guided missile battalion and two to four aircraft from every air defense fighter squadron are on combat alert in 5-minute readiness; in addition, four aircraft from every squadron are on 15-minute combat readiness. Reconnaissance of air targets is being carried on by stationary ground centers and posts.

The main forces of WEST's allied naval forces are carrying out relocation to areas of combat assignment. Multipurpose US carrier groups (Eisenhower, Nimitz, Forrestal, and America) are en route in the eastern Atlantic. The number of nuclear-powered missile submarines on patrol has increased to 20 in the North Atlantic and to 4 in the Sea of Norway. A two- to threefold increase has been noted in the number of flights of patrol aircraft at the North Cape, Bear Island, Faeroe Islands, and Iceland antisubmarine lines; hunter-killer groups of three to five ships each are carrying on submarine search in the Baltic and North Seas and the Sea of Norway. Part of the naval forces of the FRG and Denmark have been moved out for an exercise in the zone of the Baltic Straits. Ships of the French and British Navies are working out combat training tasks in the zone of the English Channel and in the North Sea.


ADDITIONAL DATA ON THE ENEMY

All types of reconnaissance have established:

- the additional callup of second-category reservists to BREMEN, HANNOVER, WIESBADEN, MUNICH, and ANTWERP;
- work of groups of military personnel on the terrain in the areas of WITZENHAUSEN and SONTRA (50 to 80 kilometers east and southeast of KASSEL), CHAM and ZWIESEL (northeast and southeast [sic] of REGENSBURG);
- the departure of Pershing operational-tactical missile launchers under a US infantry guard on the night of 3 to 4 April from NEU-ULM in the direction of HEIDENHEIM;
- the presence of subunits of US airborne troops in the area of MANNHEIM;
- the arrival on 2 April of subunits of FRG mountain infantry troops in the area of PFARRKIRCHER [sic-PFARRKIRCHEN] (105 kilometers northeast of MUNICH);
- the landing of aircraft of the US Air Force at the airfields of EWER (FRG) [EVER in Russian; possibly Evere, Belgium, or Jever, West Germany] and WALKENBURG (Holland);

- reinforcement with FRG military personnel of the security of nuclear warheads depots in the areas of KAISERSLAUTERN and PIRMASENS and of the COLOGNE, BONN, and SEMBACH airfields;
- the digging of shafts up to 2 meters deep on roads in the areas south and east of BRAUNSCHWEIG, north of GOTTINGEN, HOF, and BAYREUTH;
- the landing of 14 helicopters with US Air Force markings on a prepared dirt site in the area 5 kilometers northeast of HANAU;
- a US Navy convoy consisting of up to 30 ships and transports 200 miles northwest of BREMERHAVEN;
- coast of England;
- the arrival of underground structures in the area of the AHRWEILER railroad station of a group of military personnel and civilians accompanied by a subunit of FRG military police; strict traffic control procedures have been established in the area;
- the appearance of sabotage-and-reconnaissance groups on the territory of the German Democratic Republic in the areas of SCHWERIN, GARDELEGEN, and MANSFELD;
- the attempt of small enemy groups to penetrate the border of the German Democratic Republic in areas 5 kilometers north of SALZWEDEL, 10 kilometers northwest of EISENACH, and 20 kilometers southwest of PLAUEN.
