INJURED EMPLOYEES, COMPENSATION COMPLETED CONTINUED LIABILITY FOR MEDICAL EXPENSES

Between November 18, 1901 and April 29, 1975 there were 352 compensable in-
juries (including) for whom (except for) all compensation pay-
ments have been completed but for whom, in accordance with the provisions of the
Longshoremen's Act, the company employer/self-insurer has a continuing exposure
for reasonable and necessary medical expenses directly related to the compensable
injury, if any. Of the 352 injuries some were extremely minor, were treated in
a company medical clinic, and resulted in no lost time from active employment.
Of the 352 total cases 37 also came within the scope of the War Hazards Compensa-
tion Act and any compensation and medical payments by the employer/self-insurer
are thus fully reimbursable by the Labor Department. Three others are reimbursable
to the company by virtue of indemnification provisions contained in the contract
between the company and the United States Air Force in the performance of which
such persons were injured. The company has no up-to-date or complete file on all
of such personnel; for instance, the files with respect to 12 of such persons
were reduced to microfilm a number of years ago; and no personnel files can be
located for three persons, one of which was over 15 years ago (in February 1964)
and two over 11 years ago (1 in February 1966 and 1 in November 1966) and the
records available on these three persons indicate no treatment or cost, or contact
with the company, since August 1964 in the first case, and April 1967 and August
1967 in the latter two cases. A fabulation showing name of injured party, date
of injury, date injury reported to OWCP, type and extent of injury, cost of treat-
ment up toJanuary 1979, nature of treatment, date of last treatment, and date
of termination of employment, has been prepared for such 352 persons to the extent
there is any such information and/or it is available. The study is contained in
the attached 56-page compilation.
