Summary of Conclusions

1. State will develop and execute a diplomatic strategy to convince Tudjman that the U.S. (and EU) will not tolerate a forced reintegration of Eastern Slavonia. The plan should identify his pressure points and ways to enlist the support of our European allies. (C)

3. Deputies agreed to recommend that the U.S. extend the NATO in extremis extraction commitment from UNCRO to the mission in Eastern Slavonia. State will lead a NAC effort to incorporate this commitment into current NATO operational plans. (C)
