Summary of Conclusions

1. State will develop and execute a diplomatic strategy to convince Tudjman that the U.S. (and EU) will not tolerate a forced reintegration of Eastern Slavonia. The plan should identify his pressure points and ways to enlist the support of our European allies. (C)

2. By COB December 21, OSD will provide a troop recruitment plan for Eastern Slavonia, including proposed countries, type unit and size requested. Deputies agreed to approach Turkey with a request to augment its contribution to IFOR so that part of the Nordic contribution could be transferred from IFOR to Eastern Slavonia. State will prepare appropriate messages, including letters and talking points to heads of state by COB December 21.

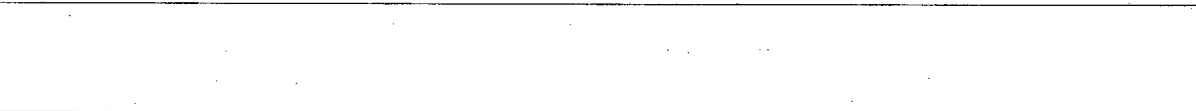

3. Deputies agreed to recommend that the U.S. extend the NATO in extremis extraction commitment from UNCRO to the mission in Eastern Slavonia. State will lead a NAC effort to incorporate this commitment into current NATO operational plans. ~~(C)~~

4. OSD will write a one-page paper and talking points on U.S. willingness to provide logistics and transportation support on a reimbursable basis to the mission in Eastern Slavonia. ~~(C)~~

5. State will continue to pursue early confidence-building measures with the parties, primarily demilitarization. ~~(C)~~

6. Deputies agreed on the importance of a robust staffing support for Eastern Slavonia. State will develop a plan for State, OSD, and AID for staff support to the Transitional Administrator, both in Washington and in the field. ~~(C)~~
