MEMORANDUM FOR: THE RECORD

SUBJECT : Additional Funds for MKULTRA Subproject 10

1. [redacted] located at the [redacted] was requested by TSS/[redacted] to enlarge the scope of his current research program. This request was made by the [redacted] Division to enable [redacted] to pursue areas of research of interest to TSS/[redacted]

2. The areas of research that [redacted] will investigate will cover the evaluation of certain known techniques for predicting the type and magnitude of the effects of drugs, particularly LSD and alcohol. In addition to the above, there will be an increased effort to exploit certain techniques developed by [redacted] group in the course of their LSD studies for predicting LSD effects, and adapt these techniques to alcohol studies.

3. The cost of this program for a period of one year will be \$5,500.00. To this must be added a four percent service charge of \$220.00 to the Geschickter Fund for its services. Charges should be made against allotment 6-2502-10-001.

4. The same Memorandum of Agreement applies to this extension as was agreed upon in the original project. However, this additional money will not be accounted for separately, but will be accounted for in the overall project accounting.

P R O S P E C T U S

In the past three years of research with the drug LSD-25, we have developed reliable methods of analyzing social situations and interactions. Our progress in assessing personality types is useful in diagnosis and prediction. These methods are based on a multi-discipline assessment of personality in dynamic social adjustment under normal circumstances and under stress, i.e., drug effect, irrespective of the attributes of any specific drug.

The briefest phrase to characterize our main area of study is "social personality". A laboratory of experimental social psychiatry has been established in such a way that various types of personality and many situations may be subjected to critical study. For example, its methods can be applied to any specific problem such as the effects of LSD or other drugs like alcohol, on the improvement of interpersonal relations.

There are two important steps to be taken: (1) Completing the work in progress of personality types so we can define more clearly our social personality types and relate them to (a) the more standard, objective tests such as the Wechsler-Bellevue on which Gittinger's theory of types is based, and (b) the conventional clinical projective tests such as the Rorschach and Thematic Apperception Tests; (2) Trying out the utility of these tests and special interview and questionnaire methods developed in the course of our studies for predicting specifiable change in social behavior following the ingestion of various drugs, particularly LSD and alcohol.
