

: Project AEACRE (Renewal)

SR - Domestic Operations Base


1. The attached project, originating in SR Division, is presented for renewal for the period 1 July 1961 through 30 June 1962. This project provides for the services of all contract employees, contract agents, and safehousekeepers not otherwise provided for in the operational and training programs of SR/Domestic Operations Base.

2. Authority is requested to obligate (in fiscal year 1962, subject to the availability of funds. This estimate includes (for salaries of three contract personnel performing all-around duties; \$13,860 for payment to three safehousekeeping couples; \$14,200 for salaries of two principal agents in the field; \$1,800 for payment to two part-time spotters; and \$2,500 for the cost of a replacement QP vehicle for a principal agent in Germany.

3. The attached request for renewal summarizes project activities and lists personnel currently covered by the project. The Division states that the contract personnel have made a generous contribution to any success enjoyed having participated substantially in the AEDEPOT activity and allied programs. In addition to SR programs, they have supported activities of TSD, OTR, DPD, and several area divisions. One contract employee was released to another component of the Agency during the past year, and the Division anticipated replacing him at a suitable time.

4. Appropriate Special Staff elements concur in recommending renewal of this project.

1. The purpose of this memorandum is to request renewal of Project AEACRE for the Fiscal Year 1 July 1961 through 30 June 1962.

## a. Current Objectives

The SR Domestic Operations Base has been funded as a Class A Station since 1 July 1958. The requirement for this project is based purely on the need for an over-all mechanism to provide for the capability of handling REDSOX matters and to cover the services of all contract employees, contract agents and housekeepers not otherwise provided for, in the operational and training programs carried out by this station. Progress is reflected in the accomplishments listed under the caption Effectiveness below.

b. Changes

There have been no changes relative to the objectives during the past fiscal year. One contract employee formerly carried by the project (Mario K. Giordano (P)) was released to another component of the Agency. A second contract employee (John H. Reingewirtz (P)) was transferred from ZI duty to an overseas assignment in Eastern Europe.

c. Intelligence Production

Not applicable.

d. Effectiveness

1. As mentioned heretofore, the contract personnel have made a generous contribution to any success enjoyed by this station. This still holds true, and although the REDSOX activity

has been curtailed, those presently under contract have a good measure of participation in the AEDEPOT activity and allied programs. These allied programs included support of SR Division activities as well as those of TSD, OTR, DPD, EE, NE, WH and others.

2. SR/DOB has successfully complied with current economy limitations in that, with a minimum of personnel, it has been able to maintain the purpose of its original charter and continually has supplied above-average agent personnel through its AEDEPOT mechanism. Presently one contract employee is assigned for primary SA&E duty while another is basically used in an instructor capacity in the Training Section; however, each of these, as will be further noted, has made additional substantial contributions to the tasks at hand during the past year. Their primary tasks for the ensuing fiscal year will be in support of the AEDEPOT Project which will again effectively train approximately 24 agent candidates in Classes IX and X as well as refresher courses for Classes I through VIII. It is presumed with the present curtailment of personnel ceilings, they will continue to be called on for the aforementioned allied programs as well.

3. Currently assigned to projects, regular and special in the instructor type category, who would be expected to be under contract beyond July 1, 1961 is:

> U. S. born, ex-Captain Infantry -Duties: Senior Instructor. FY 1961 accomplishments: Senior AEDEPOT instructor, on several occasions from 3 weeks to 2 month periods physically supported the WH Caribbean area activity and assisted DPD upon occasion.

It is expected that because of the loss of contract employee GIORDANO, through transfer, a replacement will be sought at a suitable time as the requirement arises.

4. Assigned and used constantly as safehousekeepers in support of assessment activities, REDSKIN training, WH, EE and NE activities as well as Division requirements as directed, are the following contract personnel, all U. S. citizens.

5. In the field of assessment and recruitment the following employees are assigned:

<u>CYRIL F. ROSONY</u>: Russian born, U. S. citizen. Duties: Debriefer, evaluator, instructor. FY 1961 accomplishments: Debriefer and evaluator AEDEPOT assessment program, continuously lends support to TSS/ID in special projects, and is a part-time instructor in specialized subjects dealing with the USSR. Salary \$7029 per annum.

JOHN H. REINGEWIRTZ: Russian born, U. S. citizen. Duties: Debriefer, agent trainer, interrogator, translator and language instructor. FY 1961 accomplishments: Initially employed stateside, activity was transferred to Eastern Europe assignment performing the tasks indicated while maintaining DOB and SR capabilities in the REDSOX field. Traveled extensively in the performance of such duties. Salary \$6500 per annum.

PATRICK B. NEWENS: Estonian born, U. S. citizen. Duties: Principal agent type, agent trainer, consultant. FY 1961 accomplishments: Supported SA&E program in Eastern Europe in conjunction with REINGEWIRTZ, and other station activities. Salary \$7700 per annum.

In addition, with REDSOX potential in the offing, the SA&E structure could be expected to include the following positions should the requirement exist:

1 - U. S. part-time spotter

1 - Field part-time spotter in Eastern Europe

6. A request has been forwarded to DOB by the Frankfurt Station, to which REINGEWIRTZ is attached, setting forth the need for a replacement vehicle. As previously mentioned, this employee has traveled extensively in the course of his assignment, incurring mileage in excess of 90,000 kms. Vehicle repairs are economically unsound and a heavy duty replacement vehicle of the Kapitan class is required. Purchase as a QP vehicle will necessitate an outlay of some \$2500.

e. Problems

There have been no problems which were not resolved on the level.

f. Liaison

None directly with intelligence or security services of another government. Very limited liaison performed through appropriate fter coordination with host Division.

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## Interagency Coordination g.

Liaison and coordination of necessary activities pertaining to the Project is maintained with other U. S. Governmental Agencies through appropriate Agency offices. This is effected on an ad hoc basis with ACSI, individual Army Commands, Department of the Interior, Immigration and Naturalization Service, etc. The coordination with ACSI, in particular, has been invaluable in furthering and facilitating the recruitment phases of one activity which the project supports. Also of extreme importance has been the backstopping provided by the Department of the Army to various other activities supported by this project.

## h. Plans

There are no anticipated operational achievements in the normal sense; however, the AEDEPOT reserve cardre which forms the basic end accomplishment of one program supported by this project now numbers in excess of sixty individuals. It is expected that a total of twenty-four new agents will be trained during the= ensuing year in addition to which the bulk of reserve agents will undergo advanced training.
