Comments: This is a DOBE request for renewal, under the name WIDEFOY, of the activities formerly conducted by SR Division (as ANDEFOT and ANACHE) to meet JCS wartime UW requirements. The nature of these activities are well known from the reviews that were occasioned during the past project year by the transfer of these projects from SR to DOBE, and by the SOD "Review of Projects Which Respond to JCS Requirements for Staybehind."

This renewal requests a total of \$203,470 for FY 1965, this being an increase of \$64,270 over the estimated FY 1964 expenditures. The purpose of this increase mainly is to provide for processing thirty agents during FY 1965 as compared to twenty-three in FY 1964.

As of the time of this request the project had provided seventy-one agents for SR, twenty-five for EE, and thirteen for EE. In the case of SR and EE, these figures represented satisfaction of the bulk of their requirements; in the case of EE, only about half of the requirements were filled. The FY 1965 activity (and costs), therefore, will be mainly to satisfy EE requirements, and to recoup normal losses through attrition.

It will be recalled by everyone interested in this project that SOD, in the review cited above, seriously challenged the validity of the concepts employed by this project to satisfy JCS wartime UW requirements in the Denied Areas, and especially in the SR area; and that SOD also suggested that there should be a critical reappraisal of these JCS requirements. This has not yet been done. The appropriate time to do it is

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when the new USCINCEUR requirements are received, and the Agency is requested by the JCS to respond. This should be in the near future. When it is done, we believe there should be a reduction in the scope of this project particularly as it relates to the SR requirements. With this in view it would seem that the trend now should be toward retrenchment rather than expansion; and since better than 65 per cent of the scope of the project has been devoted to SR requirements, it would seem that there could be some retrenchment (and perhaps readjustment) in this area without prejudice to legitimate NE requirements.

The NE requirements are budgeted for independently and separately by NE Division under project ARLEAP, which requests \$19,530 for FY 1965 activities.

In view of above considerations, SOD/GB recommends that C/SOD not concur in this renewal in any amount which exceeds the FY 1964 expenditure.

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
