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AEDEPOT MISSION:

All assets will:

1. Furnish UW (a geographical area, flexible as to boundary, within or from which USCINCEUR plans to conduct unconventional warfare operations in furtherance of U.S. and/or allied military objectives) intelligence data as required.
2. Spot potential resistance leaders
3. On order, initiate organization of local resistance movements or mechanisms in their clandestine aspects.
4. Report local capabilities for clandestine UW actions, trigger clandestine UW activities and/or conduct UW as directed.
5. Render evasion and escape assistance to U.S. and allied personnel.

In addition:

1. Pending arrival of Special Forces teams, continue development and exploitation of resistance potential.
2. Arrange for reception of Special Forces teams to include establishing contact between the team leader and potential guerrilla leaders.
3. Perform functions as "principal agent" for clandestine UW aspects under the operational control of the Special Forces team leaders.

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Indigenous forces to be developed are termed either Action nuclei or a group, or groups, totalling 1500.

UW is defined as: - or is ~~EA2~~ ^{EA2}

1. ~~EA2~~ Guerrilla Warfare (GW): This is primarily a military responsibility. It comprises operations conducted generally in enemy-held territory by predominantly indigenous forces on a paramilitary or military basis supported and directed to some extent by the U.S. The purpose is to reduce the combat effectiveness, industrial capability and morale of the enemy. Agency assets provide assistance to Special Forces teams which are groups of soldiers

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specially trained to provide support, guidance and assistance to developing guerrilla forces. The teams are infiltrated into the GW areas by use of clandestine air operations. Once on the ground, an element is needed to bridge the gap between the team and indigenous resistance groups. This element is provided by AEDEPOT. The aedepot asset which performs this function is an individual or small group fluent in the language, familiar with the area, fully emp. - mine trained in clandestine techniques, willing to undertake the task, and capable of making contact with potential guerrilla leaders.

2. Evasion and Escape (E&E): This is a DEPOT responsibility and involves no military forces. It encompasses the procedures and operations whereby U.S. and allied military personnel and other selected individuals are enabled to emerge from an enemy-held or unfriendly area or areas under allied control. Recovery and rescue operations are not considered to be included in this definition.

3. Subversion against Hostile States (S&S): This is a Depot responsibility and involves no military forces. It comprises actions within enemy or enemy-occupied areas by underground resistance groups and individuals of predominantly indigenous origin, supported and directed to some extent by the U.S. The ~~XXXX~~ purpose is to reduce the military, economic, psychological and political potential of the enemy. Depot assets in an S&S area should be capable of organizing and directing the following type operations in their area: Destroy/destroy/disrupt telecommunications and power ~~XX~~ transmission facilities; reduce/reduce/destroy effectiveness of radar, missile and air defence systems; interdict lines of communications; reduce/destroy refining and petroleum storage facilities; reduce/destroy war materiel production facilities or potential.

Note: UW AREAS ARE LISTED BY PRIORITY BASED ON MILITARY REQUIREMENTS AND PROXIMITY TO PRE-PLANNED ATOMIC ATTACK TARGETS, INCLUDING ESTIMATED FALLOUT PATTERNS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PLANNED TIME PHASE OF ACTIVATION.

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ASSUMPTION

The Agency will have made contact and be in communications with indigenous individuals and groups in areas presently dominated by the enemy and in areas likely to be overrun who will be responsive to U.S. influence, direction, or control.

COMCIAEUR

1. Conduct clandestine UW operations to support SACEUR/CINCEUR OPLANS.
2. On D-Day, or earlier if directed, report to USCINCEUR the capability of in-place and/or externally-held assets to support UW operations.
3. Based on requirements developed by COMSOTFE and approved by USCINCEUR:
 - a. provide assets for UW operations.
 - b. Establish E&E mechanisms to recover isolated personnel located in Safe Areas.
 - c. Expand existing assets and develop additional assets necessary to support UW operations.
4. When directed by USCINCEUR, establish and place under the operational control of COMSOTFE the SOTFE (CIA) Liaison Group, which has the capability of:
 - a. Receiving and directing the activities of those assets and supporting mechanisms which COMCIAEUR provides in support of specific UW missions.
 - b. Providing reception plans to COMSOTFE for effecting contact between deployed assets and SFOD (Special Forces)
 - c. Providing E&E contact procedures to COMSOTFE for the conduct of evasion and escape.
5. Support military UW forces in area of CIA technical or operational competence to include: equipment, advice, training, communications, and security.

Priority I - D-Day

Priority II "not later than D+90"

COMMUNICATIONS

Provide base area terminal communications service for clandestine communications links between COMSOTFE and deployed CIA CWassets.

SUPPLY

CIA items in support of UW operations for period D-Day through D+180 days will be maintained in accordance with requirements approved by USCINCEUR.

ATOMIC OPERATIONS

Provide CIA support to COMSOTFE for the employment of ADMS (Atomic Demolition Munitions) in UW as directed by USCINCEUR.

COMCIAEUR OPLAN 100-2 EVASION AND ESCAPE

1. Provide COMSOTFE and component commanders data on areas in which E&E assistance may be expected in hostile countries for inclusion in briefing of combat air crews.
2. Conduct evasion and escape operations in designated areas to seek out, identify and take into custody, US. and Allied military personnel, military personnel of friendly nations, and other selected individuals isolated in enemy-controlled territory.
3. Submit requests for specific recovery missions to COMSOTFE.
4. Coordinate E&E operations with COMSOTFE.
5. Implement the FINGER. INDER. SYST.

COMCINAEUR - ORLAN 100-2

1. Conduct clandestine intelligence collection activities in accordance with Appendix 2.
2. Conduct exceptional operations as may be directed by US national authority.
3. Conduct clandestine counterintelligence activities.
4. Maintain appropriate intelligence liaison with U.S forces under control of SA&EUR
5. Keep USCINCEUR informed of technical and scientific intelligence requirements and exploitation capabilities
6. Support the USEUCOM Electronic Intelligence Center (EEIC), referred to in 4a (18) and 4b above, within capabilities.
7. Establish, maintain and operate the USCINCEUR Special Interrogation Facility.
8. Conduct COMINT activities as appropriate to mission assigned as a component commander, and as directed by USCINCEUR.
9. Provide necessary intelligence support for the conduct of unconventional warfare and psychological warfare operations set forth in ANNEXES H and I, respectively.
