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Notes on Section of Program Dealing with SR's Wartime Training Program

AC/DOB has indicated his concurrence in my 7 February draft. However, we discussed on 9 February the possibility of expanding the discussion under "Main Direction" to include some discussion (for the benefit of not only DDP but more particularly C/WPS who has made Bissell particularly aware of certainty that the Agency will be under pressures for the development of substantially greater numbers of assets to meet wartime requirements). I suggested to Perry that he should take a serious second look at the "Main Direction" section that I have drafted with the thought in mind that it might be expanded to include some that forewarning of the likelihood that we will need more than merely \$60,000 for augmenting the recruitment and training program - with the rehabilitation of the third Ft. Meade warehouse building in mind. I suggested that Kerry was in the best position to do initial drafting here of something that would put people on notice about the possibility, if not strong likelihood, that the third building should be rehabilitated to make possible attaining goals even more ambitious than the "30 agent" concept described in my draft. I suggested that, in lamu of waiting for the completion of the cost study currently being run by the post engineer at Meade, it would be appropriate to weave into the text of our discussion under "Main Direction" words to the effect that the costs for rehabilitating the third building to make possible enlarging the scope of our training even further are currently being developed - can be expected to be in the general area of not in excess of \$20,000 etc., etc.

(Actually, it would probably be well to get over the point that the renovation of the third barracks would be entirely justifiable for the purpose of facilitating greatly the implementation of our training program even if we don't go beyond the goal of "30 agents per group" as reflected in the draft as currently written.)
