Accomplishments Fiscal Year 1960:

This past year two groups of agents completed the prescribed training in which clandestine communications as well as infiltration/exfiltration techniques were emphasized. Also, agents given basic training during the previous years were given refresher including advanced training. The Fiscal Year 1960 trainees, along with others, will be held (in the United States) as reservists, retrained annually, and are expected to be available on short notice for the satisfaction of priority Joint Chiefs of Staff requirements prior or subsequent to the outbreak of hostilities. In addition, in the interests of efficiency and economy, and of recasting its reserve program as a centrally-managed common interest striking power, the Division supported two WH Division operations through the active participation of five agents from the Division's reserve program with one held in reserve; ~~executed~~ a similar recruitment and reserve training program for NE Division; and provided to EE Division the ~~use of~~ training instructors and separate safehouse facilities for use in training agents for wartime use. General:

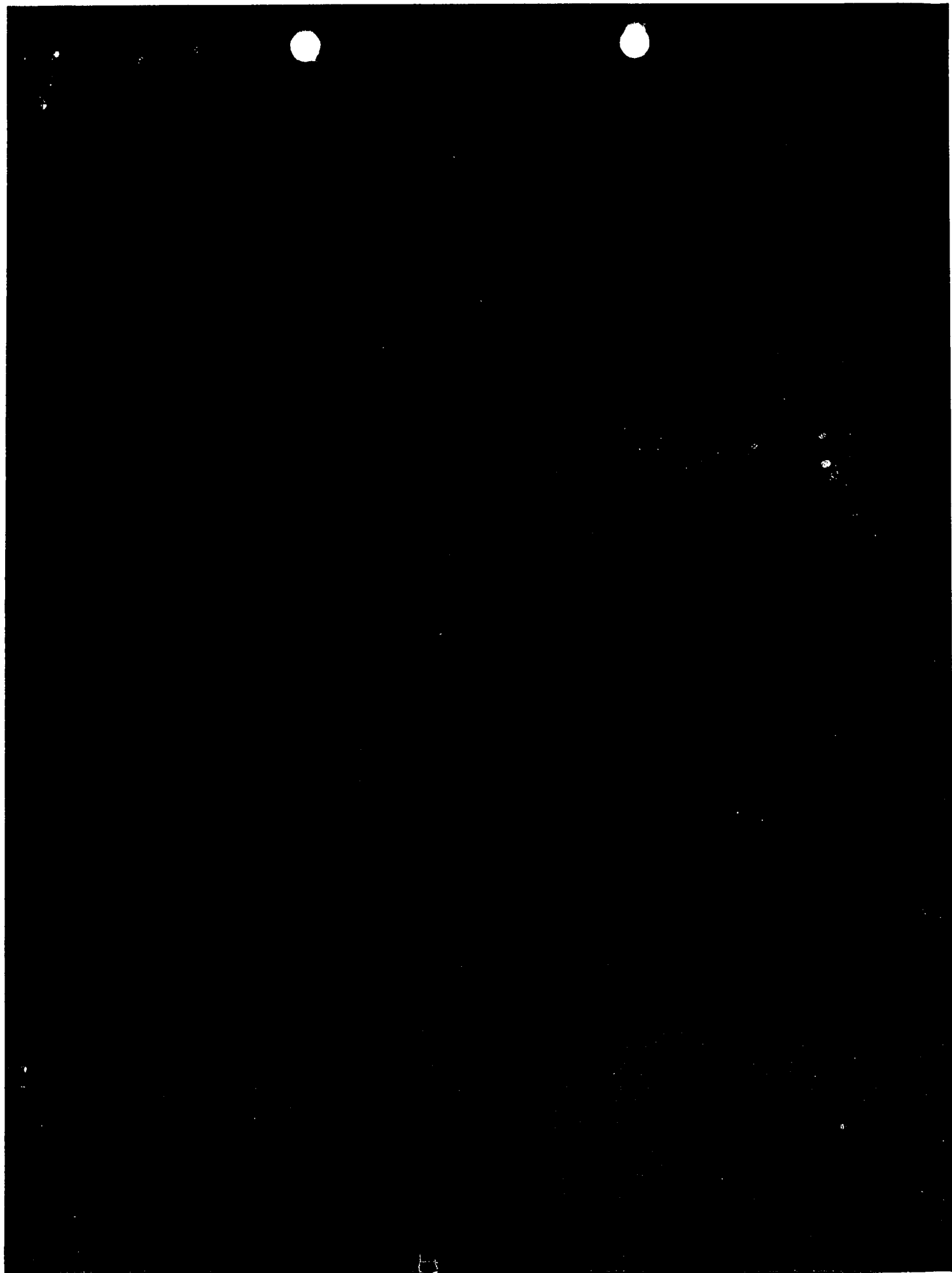

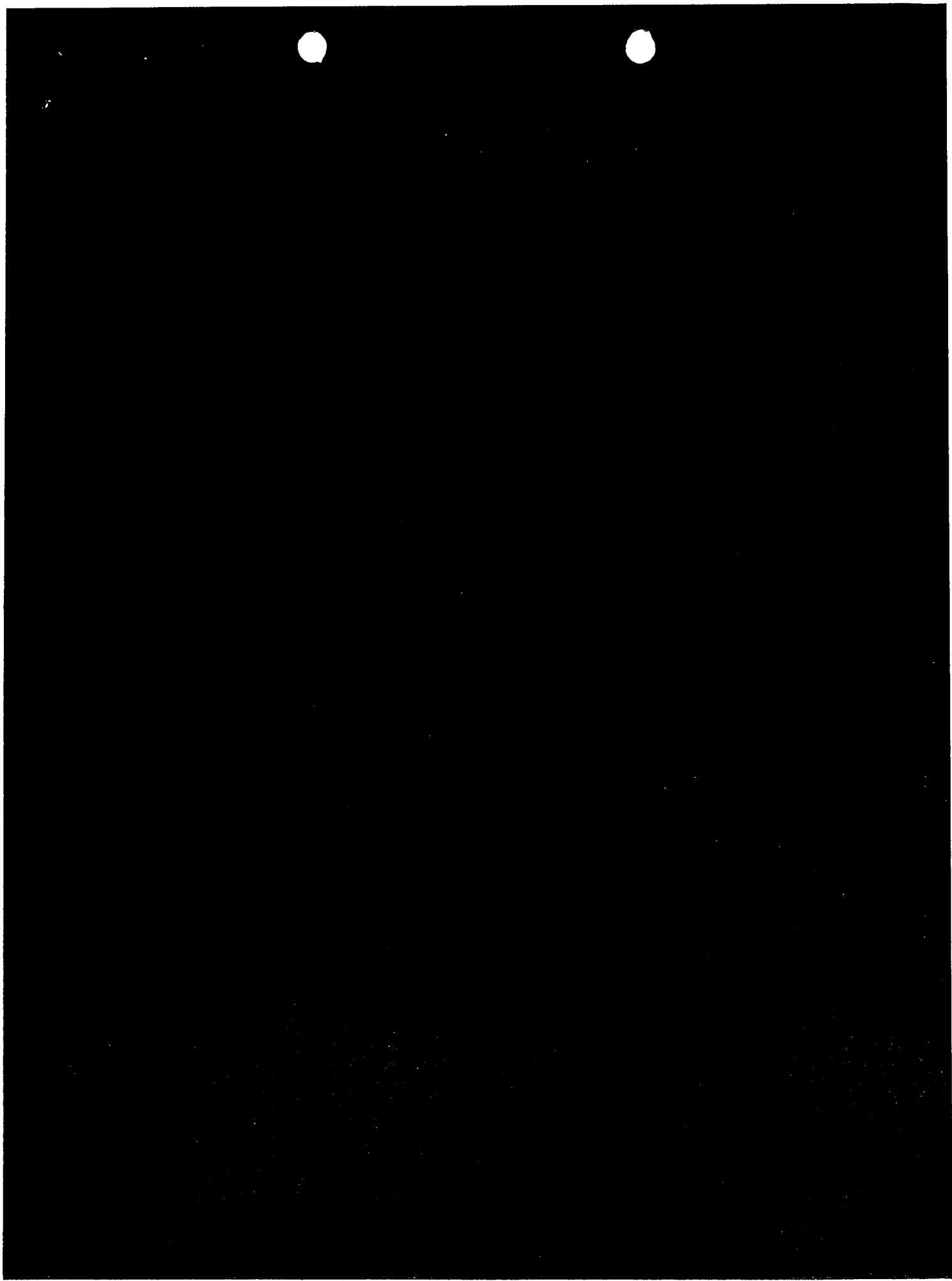

1. Per our conversation today attached are papers for you to look over. As you will notice I am sending you an extract of the section on "Stay-Behind Activities" reflected in SR Division's submission against last year's "Office Estimate" requirement. Obviously, "Stay-Behind Activities" does not exactly describe SR's approach to the war preparation problem achieved through AEDEPOT but "Stay-Behind Activities" is the budgetary category which the Agency Budget Division insists on using. What remains to be done is to up-date what was said in the 30 September 1959 document so that it will be suitable for incorporation into SR Division's "Office Estimate" submission which is due this month. As you will notice on the thermofaxed pages 16 through 18, we will have to use the same captions - namely "General", "Accomplishments this Past Year" (FY 1960 instead of FY 1959), and very brief statements under "Objectives" broken down by "FY 1961" and "FY 1962" (instead of FY 1960 and FY 1961 as in the case of the 30 September paper).

2. Suggest you take a crack at any adjustments you think appropriate in the separate paragraphs. I have in mind not only the usual "up-dating" but also reflecting to the extent possible in a document that must be stated as briefly as this one the sort of things that have been done (i.e., "Accomplishments") and are expected to be done (i.e., "Objectives") in support of WH Division, EE Division, and NE Division.
