SUBJECT

: Project AEMANNER (Amendment)

1. Reference is made to Project AEMANNER and renewal (attached), which was approved by Chief, FI, on 14 September 1956.

2. It is requested that Project AEMANNER be amended to permit CIA to utilize the services of [____]) in the United States. [____] and his family immigrated to the United States on 27 February 1957. Although he immigrated for personal rather than operational reasons, it is planned to take advantage of his presence in the United States to assist in the AEAMBER Project, in the developmental stage of which he played a key role.

Within a reasonable time after his arrival in the United States 3. J will serve as a consultant in the last phases of the AEAMBER ٠Ľ Project for a period of about two weeks, but not to exceed three months. During this period of time he will be required to travel one or more times to the AEAMBER training area from his home, about 700 miles away. Because of the operational schedule of AEAMBER, Γ .] was asked to travel to the United States several months before regular immigrant transportation would have been available. In order to minimize the inconvenience and expense thus incurred, he will be reimbursed for travel expenses of himself and of his family and for the shipment of personal and household effects, in accordance with standard government travel regulations. Travel expenses and per diem will be allowed when he is on authorized duty in the United States. Upon completion of his services in connection with y will be terminated as a fulltime agent and will be AEAMBER, 🗂 given a bonus to assist him in resettling himself and his family in the United States.

4. After [] has made a good start toward resettlement, he may be asked to perform occasional and part-time operational tasks in connection with current REDSKIN operations under Project AEMANNER. Among the tasks he will be asked to perform is reporting operational and recruitment leads that come to his attention.

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- 5. The cost of this amendment is broken down as follows:

 - c. Travel and per diem for operational travel in the United States.
 - d. E] salary @ \$25 a month from 1 April to 31 July 1957. See paragraph 4 above.

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6. It is anticipated that $\Box = \neg$ will begin his services in connection with Project AEAMBER on about 1 March 1957. He will be reduced to the lower monthly rate no later than three months after he begins his duties on AEAMBER.

7. It is requested that the financial authorization in the current renewal of Project AEMANNER be increased by \$3,100.

MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief of Foreign Intelligence

SUBJECT

: Project AEMANNER (Renewal)

1. The attached project originating in SR Division is presented for approval of renewal for the period 1 August 1956 through 31 July 1957. The purpose of the project is to procure intelligence concerning Lithuania and the USSR with the primary effort directed toward the development of REDSKIN leads such as mail channels, contacts with selected emigres and legal travelers, and the additional effort of spotting and development of REDSOX agents. The base of operations is the Western Hemisphere and Europe. The project is in consonance with the Clandestine Services General Plan---USSR Operational Program.

2. Authority is requested to obligate \$23,200 from the DD/P-SR Division budget: \$21,316 for the current fiscal year and \$1,884 for fiscal year 1958 subject to the availability of funds.

3. The attached memorandum prepared in SR Division summarizes the important factors involved.

4. CI Staff approves the project renewal with the stipulation that CI/OPS be briefed regarding the eight mail channels into Lithuania.

5. I recommend renewal of Project AEMANNER subject to the stipulation in paragraph four above.

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Review of Project <u>AEMANNER</u> SR/Washington D.C. Area <u>Lithuanian</u> SSR Period: April 1955 - August 1956

1. No positive disseminations have been produced by AEMANNER since its approval as a project in April 1955. However, its capabilities have presumably developed to the extent that some positive intelligence production can be expected during the coming year.
