ACTION REQUESTED: A. Preparation of a Field Project Outline for to be submitted to Headquarters prior to 15 April 1958.
B. Preparation of a Field Project Outline and an Operational Review of Project ARMARKER to be sub-
mitted to Headquarters prior to 15 April 1958.
1. We are transmitting under separate cover one copy of the ARMANNER project renewal. This renewal is effective for the period 1 August 1957 to
31 July 1958. It is requested that the Field prepare a Field Outline (See Field Instruction 236-1, Remmbered ER-230-60, 27 October 1953) and an
operational review of this project, which can be used as the basis for a renewal. Because Chief, KU/UBE requires that the project be submitted for
renewal before 1 May 195\$, we request that the Field Project Outline arrive
at Headquarters no later than 15 April 1958.
2. One of the major difficulties in obtaining a renewal of this project has been the problem of administrative support of \(\square \text{\square} \square s \text{ activities}
Two examples of this problem are the charging of \$10,000.00 to Project AEMANNER while he was still being carried under Project AEPGLE, and the use of an
expensive cover. In order to reduce these difficulties, we request that the
Field prepare a separate Field Project Outline for a new project to support I and his sub-agents. The project proposal for vill be an
entirely new one with the cryptonym AECORSAIR. A vill become a principal agent within the new project. Since 1 19
presently carried under Project ASMANNER, we will need this Field Project Outline at the same time as the Field Project Outline for renewal of AFMANNER.
We suggest that you include and other sub-agents of and in this Field Project Outline, and assign these sub-agents appropriate AECORSAIR
(Coordinating officer) (Authenticating officer)
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- the residence requirement for United States citisenship. We understand his year of residence will be completed on 1 March 1958. However, because of RIS interest in

 as indicated in its instructions to
 we are re-considering the value of assigning him to Germany at all. This is being discussed in another dispatch.
- 5. Our original request for renewal of the project requested funds for the escrew account which had been arranged for

 This request has been turned down, with the athtement that the amount now held in escrew should be recovered. If

 should return to the West, or otherwise become of use, he will be paid only in accordance with his established worth.
- 6. It is authorpated that I will be transferred to another project. If this transfer is effected, we will not pay him the \$500 termination bonus. No matter what the outcome, however, it will not be necessary to include him in your Pield Project Outline.
- 7. ARMARKER project was officially credited with only four positive intelligence discensisations. This low production rate can partly be escounted for by the fact that a number of reports based on debriefings by ARMARKER agents were prepared by the reports officer in Frankfurt on operational intelligence reports, which were then forwarded without crediting Project ARMARKER.
- 8. It was the low production of positive intelligence, coupled with the difficulties over \(\subseteq \subseteq \text{S's cover, which led to the following note from Chief, KUNUBE: This is clearly a costly project with only marginal production. We have agreed to allow it to go forward to COP, KUNOVE, only because SR insists on its potential usefulness and promises to tidy it up before it is again presented for prenewal by the end of April 1958.



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9. We believe that part of the difficulty we had in obtaining a project reneval was due to the fact that the purpose of the project has not been elearly stated. We believe that we might have had less difficulty if it had been stated that the objective of the project is to establish resident intelligence agents isside Soviet Lithuania through REDSKIN operations. Contacts with emigres and legal travelers are looked for and maintained only as long as they contribute to this objective. A second and less important objective is the briefing and debriefing of legal travelers to Lithuania and interrogating escapees, defectors, and repatriates.
