PROJECT OUTLINE

PART I

1. Area of Operations.

Operations will be conducted in West Germany. Operational exigencies may occasionally require activities to be temporarily undertaken in other countries in Western Europe.

2. Purpose.

To support the activities of Identity 1 ( ) who will spot, develop, and handle CAVENUE, REDSKIN and AECOMPASS leads for Frankfurt Operations Base. In addition, Identity 1 ( ) will be used in briefing and training REDSKIN travellers. It is estimated that 70 percent of Identity 1's ( ) time will be spend on CAVENUE work, and 30 percent on his other assignments.

3. Background.

Identity 1 ( ) was originally assigned to Frankfurt Operations Base in July 1956 for use in REDSKIN operations under AEMANNER. In 1957 he was assigned to CAVENUE work in addition to his other duties. Since assignment to CAVENUE work Identity 1 ( ) has shown unusual ability in carrying to completion several operations.

5. Objectives.

The case officer in Frankfurt Operations Base will plan, guide, and coordinate the activities encompassed by this Project and undertaken by Identity 1 ( ). These activities will include spotting, developing, and handling of CAVENUE leads. Secondary activities will be spotting and developing REDSKIN and AECOMPASS leads and training and briefing REDSKIN travellers.

6. Tasks.

- a. To spot, develop, and handle residents of West Germany who are in contact with or employed by CAVENUE. This will include people who can be used in audio-surveillance operations against CAVENUE.
- b. To train and brief REDSKIN travellers to the USSR, recruited under other Frankfurt Operations Base projects.
- c. To develop REDSKIN and AECOMPASS leads uncovered in other Frankfurt Operations Base operations.

7. Personnel.

- a. Cryptonym. ( ) Identity 1.

b. Personal data. Identity 1 ( ) is a former Lithuanian underground resistance fighter during World War II. He entered on duty with KUBARK as a contract agent in March 1956 and was sent to West Germany in July 1956. It took him approximately seven months to establish his cover as a representative of a notional firm that gathers material for tourist agencies. The first two years, Identity 1 ( ) spent not more than 20 percent of his time for the cover firm. Since then, however, he has not spent more than 5 percent of his time for the cover firm. Subject's initial assignments included developing leads for maritime operations into the USSR, developing REDSKIN leads, debriefing repatriates from the USSR, and assessing REDSOX candidates. Lately, Subject has been concerned almost entirely with developing and handling CAVENUE support and penetration agents. In addition, he is handling and developing one REDSKIN agent and one AECOMPASS agent. Subject performs his tasks in an efficient, secure manner. He has been instrumental in achieving success in several CAVENUE operations.

8. Coordination.

Coordination may be required with other bases of the German Station from time to time. No coordination is anticipated outside the German Station.

9. Cover.

- a. Case Officer. The case officer is known to Identity 1 ( ) as a member of KUBARK. The sub-agents will know the case officer as a FBPRIME intelligence officer, except in cases where security will make it desirable that the potential sub-agents not know the case officer.

b. Contract Employee. Identity 1 ( )'s cover for status will be that of an employee of Identity 2 ( ), a notional firm which ostensibly gathers information for travel agencies. In his operations, Subject will be a FBPRIME intelligence agent, an employee of the Department of the Army, or a free-lance journalist. Subject will not have any access to any KUBARK installations.

10. Contact and Communications.

Direct personal contact between the case officer and Identity 1 ( ) will be maintained by holding meetings in a safehouse. The meetings will be arranged in advance or by innocuous-sounding telephone calls or letters to a mail drop (post office box). There are no special problems with regard to communications.

11. Control and Motivation.

Identity 1's ( ) basic motivation is the desire to make a career of intelligence work with KUBARK. In addition, Subject has a desire to contribute to FBPRIME's work in fighting Communism which has enslaved the country in which he was born. Control in this case rests primarily in the fact that Identity 1 ( ) is a loyal citizen of FBPRIME. In addition, he is dependent entirely on KUBARK for his income.

12. Equipment and other Support.

It is envisaged that the automobile now assigned to Identity 1 ( ) will have to be replaced within the next year. The new vehicle will be purchased by Identity 1 ( ).

13. Timetable.

The operations encompassed by this proposed Project are already partially in effect under Frankfurt Operations Base's CAVENUE program and Project AECOMPASS. This proposed project should become effective as soon as possible since project AEMANNER under which Identity 1 ( ) is now paid, is expiring shortly. It is anticipated that this project will continue for a minimum of two years.
