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#### MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief of Foreign Intelligence

SUBJECT

: Project AEMARSH (Renewal)

1. The attached project, originating in the SR Division, is designed to develop resident agent assets through utilization of legal travelers to and from Latvian SSR and to procure positive and operational intelligence on that area. It is presented for your approval of renewal for the period 1 March 1958 through 28 February 1959.

2. Authority is requested to obligate  $C = 2^{max}$  the DD/P-SR Division budget: C = 1 for the current fiscal year, and C = 1 for the fiscal year 1959, subject to the availability of funds.

3. The SR Division memorandum requesting renewal is attached. It summarizes the pertinent factors involved and presents a breakdown of the funds requested.

4. A review by RQM/RE of the project's last approval period reveals that 24 positive information disseminations were produced. One report was considered by Navy to have filled a priority intelligence need and further reporting was requested. Other Navy evaluations rated AEMARSH reports of value or considerable value. RCM/RE has given the project a subjective rating of "C".

5. I recommend renewal of Project AEMARSH as presented.

### Review of Project <u>AEMARSH</u> SR/Washington D.C.

### 1. Production and Evaluation

Project AEMARSH, designed for the development of resident agents through the utilization of legal travellers to and from the Latvian SSR, and for the acquisition of operational and positive intelligence on the USSR, produced 24 positive information disseminations during the twelve months - 1 April 1957 through March 1958. The majority of these concerned Polish and Soviet Baltic ports and included information on harbor facilities and installations, naval units and maritime activities. Also included was information on military installations in the vicinity of Riga, and on military personnel and on unidentified construction in a restricted area near Ventspils. One dissemination reported on security controls in the port of Arkangelsk and on the observation of the trial run of a newtype small boat of unusual design. This latter information was considered by Navy to have filled a priority intelligence . need and further reporting was requested. Other Navy evaluations rated AEMARSH reports of value or of considerable value, although parts of two of these highly-rated reports were considered of only slight value.

#### 2. Requirements

Twelve references to Navy or OSI requirements appeared on AEMARSH disseminations.

### 3. Rating of Production: C

#### 4. <u>Recommendation</u>

Renewal is recommended.

1. It is requested that Project AEMARSH be renewed for the period 1 March 1958 through 28 February 1959 in the amount of L

2. AEMARSH is a REDSKIN Project designed to gather positive and operational intelligence on the USSR, and develop resident agent assets through utilization of legal travelers to and from the Latvian SSR.

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### 4. Activities and Accomplishments Since Last Renewal of Project.

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a. AEMARSH/1 ()A # C-35511. 24 February 1955) is being utilized as a principal agent for  $\Box$   $\Box$  as well as a recruiter and briefer of REDSKIN assets in West Germany. He interviewed several Volksdeutcher Latvians who repatriated to Germany and submitted a series of four reports containing operational and positive intelligence. Two of these reports were disseminated, one contained operational intelligence of some value and the fourth was assessed as of no value. He is developing  $\Box$   $\Box$  and  $\Box$  lunder Project AEROOT for REDSKIN missions into the target area and has spotted agent candidates for Project AECOMPASS.

b.  $\angle$  J OA # C-4198, 10 January 1956) was legally repatriated to Latvia in 1956. Approximately one year after his repatriation the first S/W letter was received concerning operational matters. This operation is now being developed to re-establish agent's confidence and exploit him for the purpose of procuring intelligence and developing controlled sources in the target area.

c.  $\Box$   $\supset$  (OA # C54186, 27 March 1957) who returned to the Latvian SSR in 1956 has not established S/W contact with us in response to our two S/W messages to him since his return. He claims to be a laboratory technician in the chemistry department of the University of Latvia at Riga, a position which should enable him to spot and/or recruit agent assets among the faculty and student body.

d.  $\Box = \neg (0A \# C-18595)$ , 12 September 1957) formerlv known as  $\Box = \neg 1$  is a general utility agent of  $\Box = \neg \neg 1$  who is called upon from time to time for special tasks. He enjoys extensive contacts among Latvian Emigres in Sweden through whom he is made aware of REDSKIN prospects and opportunities:

1) He obtained a lead on and subsequently interviewed a former Latvian national who is employed as a contract pilot on the Suez Canal. His report was turned over to NE/A Division. This pilot appeared to have high potential for recruitment in that vital area.

2) He interviewed several educators from Estonia and Latvia who were on legal travel in Sweden and Norway. His reports have been received at Headquarters and are being processed for dissemination.

3) He has spotted a Latvian woman working in a Stockholm travel agency who is well placed for spotting legal travelers going into the USSR. Stockholm Station is checking for further PRQ I data on her incident to possible recruitment.

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4) He continues reporting on Latvian emigre groups in Sweden including indications of RIS activity among these groups.

2.55 A total of 24 positive information reports were received during the past project year of which 22 were disseminated as containing information of intelligence value.

F. AECAMBARO/1, whose association with the AIS is known to the RIS in connection with the roll-up of the AECOB operations, will either be transferred to another project or disposal will be effected.

### 5. <u>New Personnel and Operations being Planned or Developed for the</u> Project Year.

Inasmuch as Riga was opened to foreign travelers starting in September 1957, and in view of the prospect for increased cultural and technological exchanges as a result of recent agreements arrived at with the Soviet government, it is felt that the REDSKIN potential of U. S. travelers merits substantial re-emphasis during this project year. Action is therefore being taken, and will continue throughout the project year, to spot, assess, recruit, train and brief suitable U. S. nationals with a desire and capability for travel in the target area. Accordingly, the following recruitments have been or are about to be effected:

a.  $\Box$   $\neg$  (OA # C39877, 9 January 1958) who is to spot among emigre groups. As Secretary-General of the American Latvian Association he is in a position to check the considerable correspondence from Latvia, addressed care of the ALA for forwarding to the addressees. Such screening should produce leads on potential internal target assets, prospective American assets as well as miscellaneous operational and positive intelligence.

b.  $\Box$   $\neg$  (PCSA # C37519/50207, 11 February 1958) is a member of the Committee for Free Latvia. As a covert associate he will be used as an informant and spotter among U. S. nationals of Latvian extraction who have potential for legal travel to the Latvian SSR.

c. AEMARSH/15 (OA # C-57807, 28 October 1957) is in S/W correspondence with two Latvians who claim a capability for establishing an internal net of action agents. Careful assessment and development is now in progress.

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d.  $\Box$   $\neg$  (POA # C-67692, 27 February 1958) is a naturalized U. S. citizen of Latvian birth. She is a college student who has accepted an invitation to serve as a guide at the Brussels Universal and International Exhibition from April to October 1958. She will be briefed to observe for vulnerability data and elicit biographic data among the guide groups of the Soviet and satelite pavilions. She will also be instructed to remain alert for signs of disaffection among any of the orbit visitors with whom she may have contact.

e.  $\Box$   $\Box$  (OA # C-33890, 6 June 1955) is a Baptist Minister in Washington, D. C., who has been invited by the Soviet Government to visit the USSR during the summer of 1958 for the purpose of confering with Russian Baptist Church leaders. He will be briefed as a source of positive and operational intelligence with emphasis on assessment of selected target personalities and selection of several favorable dead-drop sites.

f. It is anticipated that leads to REDSKIN assets will be, in most instances, among those U. S. nationals who not only have indicated a desire to travel to Riga but are capable of financing such travel. If an asset of high potential but inadequate personal funds should be spotted, favorably assessed and recruited, an amendment to the project can be submitted for approval to financially sponsor such travel.
