- 1. In order to bring the Field Case Officer up to date on AECHOR matters prior to his visit with AECAMEISTA/L, the undersigned, Headquarters Case Officer on AECHOR, offers the following information.
- 2. On 1 December 1958, AEGAMEISTA/11 informed the undersigned that the charter for the non-profit organization had been finalized to the point where it needed only the signatures of the officers of the organization to make it legal. Since these persons do not live in close proximity to each other the mechanics of mailing etc. will require approximately four weeks for completion. The sum involved will be funded via a philanthropist or foundation to the non-profit organization.
- 3. A letter pley involving an authentic envelope from Byelorussia coupled with a letter written by AECAMEISTA/11 and both to be reproduced in the pages of the AECHOR newspaper is contemplated for the early part of 1959. The letter purportedly will be from a young Byelorussian, using a "letter from home" format, in which he will write of conditions in Byelorussia, vox populae, rumors, stories etc., and of course, whatever pure fabrication seems at the moment of writing, to be most profitable. The first letter has been produced and has been commented upon by KUFIRE personnal. Revisions as suggested, will be accomplished and the letter them will be forwarded to the AECHOR Field Case Officer for comment and implementation. It is hopefully planned that the letter pley be a continuing thing with the letters being published at irregular intervals of four to six weeks.
- AKPRIMER/1 informed the undersigned that a recent emigre from BYELOHUSSIA via Poland has information concerning ABCANPOSANTO/8. The person concerned has known AMPRIMER/1 and AECAMPCSANTO/8 since the time when both were young man attending school at NOVOTECHEK. The informant states that AFCAMPOSANTO/8 had appeared at her home in the uniform of a Soviet Majer. He asked aid and asylum which she agreed to give. ARCAMPOSANTO/8 stayed for only a short while but told her before he left that he and some friends had killed a high ranking Soviet military commander plus other Soviets at a command post during a period of time when the Soviets were holding military maneuvers. Source states that she learned later that he had been arrested and was to be given a public trial. AECAMPOSANTO/8 was to make a public confession of his evil deeds, disclose his fellow conspirators, plead for mercy, etc. At the appointed time, in BARANGVICHI, ARCAMPOSANTO/8 rose and instead of confessing, cried out scmething to the effect, "Long Live a Free Byelorussia" and "Doon with the Soviet Oppressors". He was immediately hustled away by the Security forces. His outeries made quite an impression upon the populace. Many demonstrations, approaching riots, broke out in BARANOVICHI. When his execution was amnounced the demonstrations broke out again. Source says that the people and at first believed Soviet press accounts that AECAMPOSANTO/8 was a Western agent. However, after his outburst at the public confession and his execution, people began to speak of him as a true Byelorusaian patriot and a martyr. People said that have was proof that people in the West had not forgotten the Byelorussians and that someone was still trying to help them. As a result of the incident and the demonstrations, L. BERIYA is sued a decree that all residents of Byelerussian terms and villages not indegenous theretowould be required to register with the police. Included among those needing to register would be not only transients but also those persons returned to Byelorassia from other Soviet lands and/or labor camps. This decree caused serious elera among the people, especially those having relatives returned "from the east". Fortunately BERIIA was himself executed before the order could be put into effect. C My

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5. Since the information related in para h., above, was received second hand, APPRIMER/1 has been directed to visit the source, who is now in PEPRIME, during 30 December - 2 January, to learn all the details of this interesting incident which is at such variance with the Soviet account of the AECAMPOSANTO surfacing in their "Quadrant B-52".
