MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, SR/6

SUBJECT: Postal Penetration Capabilities and Petential of SR/DOB Assets.

- L. Project AEQUOR/PP, a Byelerussian Project, has proven that it is capable of postal penetration of Poland and Byelerussia and that it has a penetration potential that has not been fully explaited.
- 2. The penetration is accomplished via international mail. The Agency spensored Byelcrussian newspaper, THE BATSKAUVSHEHIMA, and various pamphlets and books either produced or purchased by the ARGOR complex are nation from Vest Germany, France and Belgium into Peland and Byelcrussia. In addition, it is presumed that the penetration is also affected by mail to Peland and then re-routing to Byelcrussia either by mail or be courier. (AELARDER/1 reported upon his return from Peland in February 1958, a copy of which is attached, that there are practically no mail or parcel post restrictions between Peland and Byelcrussia).
- 3. Material which has been sent by the AEQUOR apparatus includes in part:
 - a. Hemspapers THE BATSKAUVSICHINA (a bi-menthly newspaper)
 - b. Books SPADCHIMA (book sont to the Byelerussian Cultural Systematod in BIALISTOK)
 - LIA CHUZRIKH BERAGOI (book sent to preceeding address also)
 - c. Pamphlets The Systerussian Independence Day Manifesto (a peophlet which was distributed world-wide)

h. Addresses include:

- a. The Byelorussian National Cultural Brotherhood in MIALISTON, POLAND.
- b. The HIVA, a Byolorusaian language newspaper published in BIALYSTOR, POLAND.
- c. Various newspaper effices, government agencies, cultural and scientific bureaus and to the security department in MSSR.

- d. Various persons resident in Poland and Byelorussia whose names and addresses are obtained from friends, co-workers, and overt publications. An example of the latter is the newspaper the NIMA. Persons whose names and addresses appear in the NIMA be it for official commendation, condemnation or other, are sent a copy of the BATSKAUVSHIHIMA together with a missographed sheet stating from which issue of the NIMA the persons name was obtained and that the missographed sheet is for the protection of the addresses.
- 5. That the newspaper is being received is evident from the letters posted to the editorial offices of the BATSKAUVSHCHINA (sample cepies attached) and to articles which appear from time to time in Seviet publications calling attention deregatorily to articles in the BATSKAUVSHCHINA.
- 6. The unproven potential of the ABCUCE/PP apparatus lies in that there has never been a concerted effort at postal penetration by the AECUCE personalities. Effort, of course, has been expended but dictated by addresses and funds readily available. Should a concerted effort be desired to test the potential, the Headquarters Case Officer would instigate a "letters to the editor" campaign via the AECUCE apparatus.
