D. Financial Status as of 31 January 1952:

As yet, no~~x~~ new subsidy for the first quarter of 1952 has been ~~made~~ set by Headquarters. Per MUNIFG-6230, 10,000 DM were disbursed by MOB to permit continued publication of the paper. Ten thousand DM is the minimal amount required to maintain the present output of the newspaper, but will not permit publication of DO ZBROI or any brochures, pamphlets, etc.

2. The reaction of subscribers to the newspaper has already been mentioned in earlier progress reports. The following summary of ~~SUCHASNA~~ ^{Publ} UKRAINA articles which have been reprinted in other newspapers and periodicals is an additional indication of the effectiveness of the newspaper. In each case the original source was acknowledged.

- A. The majority of reprints were made by the following Ukrainian Papers:
- U.S.A.:
 - ~~SVOBODA~~, a daily printed in Jersey City, USA, with a circulation of 20,000 copies.
 - ~~AMERIKA~~, a daily printed in Philadelphia, with a circulation of 5,000 copies.
 - ~~NARODNA VOLYA~~, a weekly printed in Scranton, with a circulation of 7,000 copies.
 - Canada:
 - ~~UKRAINSKI ROBITNIK~~, a weekly printed in Toronto.
 - ~~NOVI SHLYAKH~~, a bi-weekly published in Winnipeg.
 - ~~HOMIN UKRAINI~~, a weekly published in Toronto.
 - Argentina:
 - ~~UKRAINSKE SLOWO~~, published in Buenos Aires.
 - ~~NASH KLICH~~, published in Buenos Aires.
 - Brazil:
 - ~~PRATZYA~~, a Catholic weekly published in Prudentopolis, Brazil.

B. The ~~UKRAINIAN~~ ^{Publ} QUARTERLY of New York published (in its summer, 1951, issue) a reprint of Evhen WRECHIONA's article "The Contemporary Ukrainian Village", which appeared in issue # 1 of SUCHASNA UKRAINA, 7 January 1951.

C. The ~~UKRAINIAN~~ ^{Publ} BULLETIN of New York, the Ukrainian Press Service of London and the Spanish language monthly, UKRANIYA LIBRE, of Buenos Aires, have all reprinted articles from SUCHASNA UKRAINA.

D. The Polish military quarterly, BELLONA, published in London, reprinted a 7 January 1951 SUCHASNA UKRAINA ~~article~~ editorial entitled "The Activity of the UPA and the Death of General Taras Chuprinka". In its January-June 1951 issue, BELLONA reprinted a DO ZBROI (December 1950) article entitled "Partisan Activity in the Korean Ca

E. The Turkish Information Agency, TGA, in its 29 November 1951 bulletin, presented a summary of a SUCHASNA UKRAINA article entitled "A Pregnant Decision - The Key Position of the Southern Flank in the Struggle Against the Imperialistic Plans of Moscow" (SUCHASNA UKRAINA, issue #22, 30 October 1951). The article discusses the question of Turkey's entry into the North Atlantic Treaty Organization and the creation of a special command in the Near East. It also points out the important position occupied by Turkey as the southern neighbor of the Ukraine, where an established liberation movement already exists. All Turkish newspapers in Ankara and Istanbul printed the article on the first page.

F. The Spanish radio network CSU, Center of Spanish Universities, transmitted the complete text of "Communiques from the Liberation Struggle of the Ukraine", an article which appeared in the 27 January 1952 issue of SUCHASNA UKRAINA.
