1. Contact Operations

A. During a brief, informal meeting with Nicholad HIADUN, AECASSOWARY 2 obtained some information regarding his recent (June) trip to the Ukrainian SJR. HIADUN spent most of his time in Iwov and through the intercession of Vesyl STEPANYK, head of the Iwovska Chlast who has a son in Canada, was permitted to visit his home village near Iwov. HIADUN also visited Kiev briefly. Details will be obtained from AECASSOWARY 2.

Youth Festival under the suspices of the pro-Commist festival committee in New York, recently was notified by the Committee that his application was being rejected as they were oversubscribed. This rejection came weeks after he was notified that he had been accepted and only after he advised them that he vished to continue with the group on to Poland and the USER. He was advised by AECASSOWARY 2 to protest by letter, stating that he had gone to a lot of expense and loss of time from his employment to obtain the necessary tickets and visas. He did protest and received an apology, stating that it was all a mistake and that his application was approved. OINAYCK was encouraged by the festival committee in Combridge to try to join the pro-Communist group. He also has backstopped himself with the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

AECASSOWARY 2 is in close contact with OINAYCK regarding the trip to Vienna and the USER.

2. Significant Developments and Changes

A. A 17-page typewritten letter dated May 1959 was received in a Chicago letter drop from Stanislav, UKSSR, in which the writer attacks the INFORMATION BULLETIN and the Ukrainian emigration in great detail.

B. The 4 June 1959 issue of the <u>UCRAINERY VISTY</u> (Communist organ published in New York) carried on attack on the AECASSONARY newspaper in Munich and Ukrainian nationalists in general.
