REFERENCE(S)	<p>1. As you know, the 11th International Congress of Historical Sciences (ICHS) will convene in Stockholm on 21 August 1960 and run through 28 August. According to our information, 2900 participants are expected, among them delegates from Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Poland, Rumania and the USSR. (1500 persons took part in the 10th Congress in Rome, 8-11 September 1955, including delegates from Hungary, Poland and the USSR.) The Congress proper will be preceded by the International Conference of Economic History, 17-18 August, also to be attended by Soviet delegates, and by special colloquia and meetings of the Commissions of the ICHS, among them an International Commission for Slavonic Studies from 16 to 20 August.</p> <p>2. AECASSOWARY/1 (a Ukrainian group known to <input type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/>) has evidence that among the Soviet delegates to the Congress will be some from the Ukraine. AECASSOWARY/1 has among its supporters emigre historians who were once well known in the USSR. Several have registered for the Congress and their papers have been accepted for presentation. Judging from similar conferences elsewhere, it is definitely expected that these emigre historians will have opportunities in the course of the 12 or so days of the Congress to meet and talk to the Soviet Ukrainian delegates. With this and with other less direct means, AECASSOWARY/1 is planning an operation aimed at elicitation, direct questioning and, ultimately, partial or full recruitment (in that order) of the Soviet Ukrainian delegates. To carry out this plan, AECASSOWARY/1 is preparing to send to the Congress not only the above-mentioned well-briefed collaborators as delegates, but a P/A, AECASSOWARY/29, now being trained by KUBARK, whose job it will be to exploit these contacts to the fullest possible extent. AECASSOWARY/29 will also have the option of calling upon AECASSOWARY/1 collaborators and sympathizers in Sweden if they can be useful. FYI and for future reference, AECASSOWARY/29 is expected to be functioning as the AECASSOWARY/1 operations chief in Europe by the end of June and will thereafter be charged with directing all AECASSOWARY/1 operations in that area. Although his base of operations has not yet been selected, he will operate under the regular supervision of a KUBARK field project officer, also not yet selected. We do not exclude direct intervention of the case officer into a contact situation if it seems appropriate, particularly if he is Ukrainian speaking. Specific arrangements for Stockholm can be discussed as the Congress approaches.</p> <p>3. To help AECASSOWARY/1 formulate plans as cogently as possible, we request that <input type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/> furnish all available information on the Congress, specifically on the composition of the Soviet delegation (and its Ukrainian component in the event that it is distinguishable), as well as supporting data as to how and where the Soviet delegation will be housed, what security measures the Soviets might be expected to observe under the conditions of Stockholm, etc. - - any information which might facilitate contact operations. Whatever advice <input type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/> might offer is especially solicited.</p> <p>4. It should be stressed that AECASSOWARY/1 is planning only very selective literature distribution and no overt demonstrations -- a quiet, disciplined and tightly organized attempt to get close to the Soviet Ukrainian delegates with the least possible fuss. It should be noted that not only have the AECASSOWARIES been</p>
