1. DAVIDCHUK is an acquaintance of Helene HENDER at the Sorbonne and was introduced to AEDOGMA/1 by HENDER around 25 July 1960. He is in Paris on a scholarship from a Canadian University studying Russian at the Sorbonne, where he passed his examinations this year. This would indicate that he is a very advanced pupil.
2. DAVIDCHUK was born about 1933 in Rovno (Western Ukraine), and emigrated with his parents to Canada in 1938. He is about 1.83 tall; slender build; oval face; thin nose; black hair; small ears; wears a small black beard, cut square; likes music; drinks moderately and does not smoke.
3. DAVIDCHUK is evidently a Quaker and will depart Paris on 8 August 1960 for Moscow and Leningrad with a group of 20 American quakers who will participate in seminars with 20 Soviet students in Moscow and Leningrad. The American delegation arrives in Paris on 3 August before departing five days later for the USSR. does not plan any operational exploitation of the Quaker group, given the short time available and the paucity of information.
4. The Writer had previously discussed with AEDOGMA/1 the possibility of his engaging in some light KUCAGE activity to fill in his spare time. The plan was to exploit the anti-Russian imperialistic sentiments of the Ukrainians and allied groups and the Writer made a number of suggestions on exploitable issues which AEDOGMA/1 then proceeded to write up. He had already recruited some people for this type of activity (this will be the subject of a separate dispatch) and decided to exploit his meeting with DAVIDCHUK along the same lines. He had three meetings with him and briefed him on Soviet realities and exploitable KUCAGE themes, which DAVIDCHUK will in turn take up with the rest of the Quaker group before leaving Paris. DAVIDCHUK promised to report in detail on his experiences and impressions after returning to Paris.
5. The immediate problem is the fact that a KUBARK agent is dealing on a quasi-agent basis with a Canadian National. It is requested that Headquarters investigate the problem and take any appropriate action with Canadian authorities and guide accordingly. does not plan to have contact with DAVIDCHUK for the time being and AEDOGMA/1 will not be permitted to put the operation on any clandestine basis without explicit direction from the Station.
6. There are no traces; Headquarters and traces are requested.
