activities. Subject stated that Kentryshinsky is now teaching history at som high school in Stockholm and is financially in rather poor shape. He will also attend the August International Historians Conference. Subject described Kentryshinsky as a very intelligent and elequent person, however, with a questionable background since he seems to have been connected in intelligence activities for various governments, i.e. the Finns, the Sermans, possibly the Soviets and also attempted to establish an AIS contact by saking Subject several years ago if it would not be advisable for one of the local Ukrainians to establish an AIS contact. Subject had the impression that Kentryshinsky was either trying to flush out Subject's AIS connection by this comment or latch on himself to an AIS connection, both for material and political reasons. One of the reasons for Subject's suspicions concerning Kentryshinsky concerns the fact that Kentryshinsky's mother and brother, Greta and Taxes, respectively, have both emigrated to Sweden in 1958 at atime when such emigration was quite difficult. Grete and Taras Kentrychineky live on Valhelsvagen 69, telephone 34 26 68. I advised Subject to keep his eyes on Kentryshinsky, however, not get himself involved in any kind of operational activities with him and be particularly careful to conceal his AIS connection.

7. Comment - Both - I and the undersigned were favorably impressed by Subject's attitude toward us and his understanding and feeling for elementine operations. Subject is a person with years of conspiratorial experience, dating back to his pre-war and wartine years, and it is felt that he will be a valuable asset to - I, if and when the opportunities present theuselves such as during the forthcoming International Conference of Historians.
