<p>1. <u>Meeting Arrangements</u> - This meeting was arranged by calling Subject's summer home and announcing our arrival. The actual meeting took place in Subject's Vaesteras apartment which was a better location for the meeting since his wife and family were in the summer home. The next meeting with Subject is likely to take place on or about the 20th of August in Stockholm. [] will handle it. Subject will advise [] by mail.</p> <p>2. <u>Turnover to []</u> - [] was introduced to Subject as [] an AIS official who is permanently assigned to [] and available to meet with Subject whenever necessary. Subject and [] conferred in Russian and got along very well. There is no language problem. Commo arrangements between Subject and [] were made.</p> <p>3. <u>International Historians Conference</u> - The next operational contact with Subject is likely to coincide with the Station meeting of the International Historians Conference which meets between 20 & 28 August. Subject expects some AEGASOCHARY contacts to be present during this conference and mentioned the names of two that he knows will be present.</p> <p>A. Dr. Vasyi CHANKIN</p> <p>B. Dr. Ivan CHENAK-BIDNYCKY (both discussed in OSPA-53223, dated 6 July 1960)</p> <p>Subject's friend, Kiril BARBAR (traces requested in ref) will meet most of the Ukrainian members coming from New York and Canada to this conference and will discuss the results and developments of meetings and discussions between the USA/Ukrainian delegation with their Soviet/Ukrainian counterparts. They also plan to arrange private meetings in Harbar's home and Subject promised to keep [] advised of developments.</p> <p>4. <u>Commo Arrangements</u> -</p> <p>A. <u>From Subject to Case Officer</u> - Subject was given a letter drop to reach his case officer. He writes to [] Stockholm and signs the letter with "Olaf". In this letter Subject is to indicate the date and time he wants to be met. The place will be in front of the Nordiska Museen. In case [] is unavailable to make the meeting he will send a colleague who will know Subject by the license number of his Gray Ford Taunus (W-17700), 17 N Station Egen, and indicate to Subject that he is a friend of Mr. Gray. In this letter Subject can also indicate that he wants to be telephoned at his home or office. Subject can also reach his case officer by telephone. In that case he will call [] ask for extension 200, identify himself as Olaf and leave a message for []</p> <p>B. <u>From Case Officer to Subject</u>: Subject can receive mail at home and any letter signed by Mr. Gray will be clear to Subject as coming from his case officer. Since Subject's wife is witting of his AIS relationship no flaps are anticipated concerning the receipt of letters. Subject's home telephone in Vaesteras is 49450, with a prefix of 021 if called from a Stockholm exchange. Subject's office telephone is 021-57100. This is the orthopedic clinic. The telephone of Subject's summer home is 021-25041.</p> <p>5. <u>Subject's Mother</u> - Subject still has not received a decision concerning his mother's immigration to Sweden, however, has been receiving mail from her</p>

He hopes to obtain an affirmative decision this Fall. His mother indicated in a recent letter to him that she is in contact with Ivan LESECKUK, and when she comes to Sweden will undoubtedly have more to report about the latter.

6. Bohdan KENTRYSHINSKY - Stockholm address Kvarngatan 20, Stockholm S6, telephone 47 35 55. I asked Subject about Kentryshinsky and his present activities. Subject stated that Kentryshinsky is now teaching history at some high school in Stockholm and is financially in rather poor shape. He will also attend the August International Historians Conference. Subject described Kentryshinsky as a very intelligent and eloquent person, however, with a questionable background since he seems to have been connected in intelligence activities for various governments, i.e. the Finns, the Germans, possibly the Soviets and also attempted to establish an AIS contact by asking Subject several years ago if it would not be advisable for one of the local Ukrainians to establish an AIS contact. Subject had the impression that Kentryshinsky was either trying to flush out Subject's AIS connection by this comment or latch on himself to an AIS connection, both for material and political reasons. One of the reasons for Subject's suspicions concerning Kentryshinsky concerns the fact that Kentryshinsky's mother and brother, Greta and Taras, respectively, have both emigrated to Sweden in 1958 at a time when such emigration was quite difficult. Greta and Taras Kentryshinsky live on Valhalsvagen 69, telephone 34 26 68. I advised Subject to keep his eyes on Kentryshinsky, however, not get himself involved in any kind of operational activities with him and be particularly careful to conceal his AIS connection.

7. Comment - Both [] and the undersigned were favorably impressed by Subject's attitude toward us and his understanding and feeling for clandestine operations. Subject is a person with years of conspiratorial experience, dating back to his pre-war and wartime years, and it is felt that he will be a valuable asset to [] if and when the opportunities present themselves such as during the forthcoming International Conference of Historians.
