1. The former secretary of Myron Matrivoyko (the name could not be remembered) who lives in New York, N.Y. and is deaf told source that Dr. fnu Kurylas , a veterinarian from South Dacota, who visited the Soviet Union with his wife last July, was given an address ^{by him (the secretary)} in Lviv at which he was to check about Myron's whereabouts. Kurylas was not successful in his attempt.
2. fnu Malakhovkyi, who immigrated to this country from Poland via Paris after 1956 and worked in the Surma Bookstore , 7th Street, New York, visited Tamara ^{Przywicki} in Paris after he came out from Poland. Malakhovskiy is suspected of close contacts with the Soviets.
3. When fnu Dubrov, the Kiev ⁵arty Secretary was at the Vienna Festival last year he was waiting one day in front of the house where Volodymyr Stachiv was living to tell him that the group of higher Ukrainian Soviet officials wanted to talk to him. It remains ~~unknown~~ undisclosed how Dubrov found out where V.Stachiv was living. Eugen S. thinks that ^{this} ~~there~~ is highly probable that Tamara who knew the address ~~had~~ ^{gave} given it to the Soviets.
