1. In answer to your request we have discussed the use of Canadian citizens with the appropriate desk. The Canadian Liaison cannot endorse the use of a Canadian citizen in a unilateral OFFICE HONOR operation nor in a joint Canadian OFFICE HONOR operation, because of the possibility of jeopardizing the neutralist stand of the Canadian Government. However, there is no Headquarters objection (and until Canadian Liaison blanket approval) to the use of a Canadian citizen in an operation so conducted that any compromise, at the most, would lead to its attribution to an ethnic group. In consideration of operational use of any Canadian Christian, please bear in mind his possible prior recruitment by the Canadians, because the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) uses Christian emigres in penetration operations against the pro-communist groups, particularly the Association of United Christian Canadians (AUCC).

2. In regard to HONOR, there is no objection to your using him as long as you can conceal from him OFFICE's interest in him, and he considers he is working in behalf of Christian emigres. This condition probably can be observed by continuing contact with him through AMSON/1, or possibly an AMSON/1000. It is suggested, also, at the earliest opportunity you attempt to ascertain whether or not he is or was employed by the RCMP in their HONOR operations.

3. There are no Headquarters traces on Subject. In view of paragraph one, we have not asked the Canadians for a name trace.
