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Additional Information on Dr. GARLICKI

GARLICKI is president of the Military Medical Academy in Lodz and Chief Surgeon in the orthopedic hospital in Warsaw. He is married (wife's name unknown). His wife is presently attending the Olympic Games in Rome. GARLICKI has two sons, names unknown. The older son, twenty-four years of age, completed medical studies in Warsaw. The younger son is fourteen years old. GARLICKI has a six-room apartment in Warsaw. The family employs a maid who is a German from Bytom.

Prior to World War II GARLICKI was a member of a nationalistic Polish student organization (Narodowa Demokracja). GARLICKI claims he is not a CP member. He stated that there are only two generals in Poland who are not members of the Party, he and one other Polish general whose name he did not mention.

GARLICKI is a Catholic, but he said that he does not go to church. He said that his older son is very religious and attends church regularly.

During the German occupation of Lvov GARLICKI was employed in the Lvov University Hospital as Deputy to Professor GRUTSA, a famous orthopedic surgeon now probably in Warsaw. He stated that he and GRUTSA are not on very good terms--something about a woman being involved and also because GARLICKI replaced GRUTSA in his job at the orthopedic hospital.

GARLICKI studied medicine at the University of Lvov during the years 1927-1933. Dr. CHYLAK was a classmate of his. Dr. VOYEVIDKA was not a classmate of GARLICKI's, as mentioned in the earlier report. VOYEVIDKA knows GARLICKI only since the German occupation of Lvov.

GARLICKI originally comes from Drohobych, where his father was a high official, probably in the school system. His mother was an Ukrainian by birth, and this probably explains the reason why he is not anti-Ukrainian. GARLICKI's mother was a school teacher. She was very well known by Mrs. Daria CHYLAK nee ~~GRUBA~~, who also came from Drohobych. GARLICKI's sister is married to Dr. FODALIBEN, a Ukrainian, presently an Associate Professor (docent) of Medicine at the University of Lvov.

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GARLICKI is approximately 52 years of age. He is a very ambitious careerist who keeps pushing toward the top. He is a Polish patriot.

GARLICKI's wife is not related to General ~~SPYCHALSKI~~. Their acquaintance came about when SPYCHALSKI's wife broke a leg and suffered injury to her spine. GARLICKI attended SPYCHALSKI's wife at this time. GARLICKI knows SPYCHALSKI quite well. SPYCHALSKI is an ardent Communist. He is not a real military personality. He reached his position through his party membership and his friendship with GOMULKA.

GARLICKI was Surgeon General of the Polish Army until January 1960. GARLICKI attended orthopedic congresses in Brussels and Germany. His present trip to the United States is being financed by the Polish Government. He is allowed \$8 per day for a hotel, plus \$8 per day for food.

GARLICKI participated in the Warsaw Pact meetings, but mostly in the capacity of Surgeon General.

GARLICKI lived in Lvov until 1944, when he fled to Warsaw. He stated that the Russians came to his residence in Lvov to arrest him only two weeks after he fled. He also stated that he might have "gone to the East" if he had not fled from Lvov.

GARLICKI told VOYEVIDKA and CHYLAK that he was to meet with the Polish Military Attache from Washington on Sunday, 4 September 1960. He may come to the West again, as he usually attends orthopedic meetings, but he did not specify any specific plans for the future.

GARLICKI earns 6,500 zloty a month. He does not seem to have a lot of money, but he stated that he has everything that he needs. He is a professional not too interested in politics.

He stated that anti-Semitism is growing in Poland. He stated that the Poles made a mistake by refusing to join the Communist Party, while the Jews did join the Party. The Poles now are trying to repair the damage and are joining the Party. His statement about the Jews in Poland was "they smell" (tam smierdzi).

He can drink a good deal without getting drunk (the three men--VOYEVIDKA, GARLICKI, and CHYLAK--consumed three bottles of brandy during their meeting).

The following comments were made by GARLICKI after a recent trip to the Crimea and the Caucasuses. GARLICKI said he told his wife that "we should kiss OKWUKA in the back for keeping us from being among those suckers" (meaning the Soviets). ("Ze mo jaszowy miedzy twoi szwarz...

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He considered the American system as far as education was concerned as good, but he feels that socialized medicine is preferable. When asked what he thought of the situation in Poland, he stated that "over there (Poland) it is worse and it grows."

He stated that the economic situation is better than in Germany and he said that the East Germans are not really Germans, that the true Germans are the West Germans.

When speaking about the physicians in Poland, he stated that "many of our colleagues in Poland are professors, but you here have dollars."

Communism in Poland "does not offend one's feelings any more. We must have a realistic policy. One thing I would not like to experience is our (the Soviet Bloc) liberation of the Americans." He repeated the last statement on two occasions.

"The collective farms and so-called co-operatives in Poland are mere fiction."

"I have everything in Poland, but if I were not loyal to the Polish Government, I would be a hoodlum." ("bylbym szuga").

"American aid is beyond consideration. The Poles counted on America, but it is all over and the Poles must have a realistic policy toward the Russians. They cannot do otherwise."

He stated that Russian chauvinism in the Ukraine is overwhelming and getting worse. He feels that this chauvinism in the Soviet Union might lead to reactionary movements on the part of non-Russians in the Soviet Union. "You Ukrainians are in a bad position. Thanks to KOMUNKA, we Poles are better off. There were too many Jews in the Party before KOMUNKA came to power. The Polish intelligentsia is now trying to replace the Jews. The situation in Poland is improving. Communism is better than Nazism."

GARLICKI mentioned the name of LIEBHARD, a gynecologist in Lublin, who is an acquaintance of CEYLAK and WONEWIDKA. He stated that LIEBHARD once traveled to Paris and told GARLICKI that he was en route during his trip. GARLICKI said that no one is afraid to travel now. GARLICKI stated that on his return to Poland he would telephone LIEBHARD and tell him about the meeting with his friends.

GARLICKI stated that there were three Poles attending the pediatric congress in New York, but he did not remember their names. He mentioned the name of Dr. PAUL BARTON, an orthopedic surgeon of Canadian birth now living in Toronto, Canada. GARLICKI stated that he was hoping BARTON would attend the congress so that they could meet.

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VOYEVIDKA mentioned to ABCASSOMARY/15 that Dr. Pm^{*} REDER (phonetic spelling), a Jew from Lvov now living in Brooklyn, probably also a classmate of GARLICKI's. VOYEVIDKA stated that REDER would probably be attending the Orthopedic Congress as he "belongs to the Orthopedic elite in the U. S."

The name of the Jewish physician in the hospital in Manhattan who spoke to Dr. VOYEVIDKA about GARLICKI is Witold^{*} ZIERO' JEWSKI (former name^{*} SUENSBURG). He is known in the Manhattan hospital as "Dr. WITOLS". He does not know GARLICKI personally, but he seemed to know all about him. He lived in Warsaw until about one year ago, when he came to the states. He told Dr. VOYEVIDKA that GARLICKI was out to ruin Dr. GRUTSA, whom he replaced in the orthopedic hospital in Lodz.

GARLICKI stated that before he came to Warsaw, he worked in a hospital in Bytom. He moved to Warsaw when he received the rank of general.

Dr. VOYEVIDKA told A/15 that this meeting between the three men took place in the ORCHIDIA Restaurant on New York's lower east side and in the home of Dr. VOYEVIDKA. This meeting was observed by a number of Ukrainians who were in the restaurant at the time. Mrs. CHYLAK also met GARLICKI, whom she knows. She mentioned his name to several of her friends in the restaurant, so that there probably are a good number of Ukrainians in the New York area who now know about GARLICKI's meeting with VOYEVIDKA and CHYLAK.

GARLICKI made an appointment to meet with the two men in the ORCHIDIZ again on Friday, 9 September 1960.

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
