I. INTRODUCTION

A. Description

1. The aims of the basic project remain the same, namely, to provide for the procurement of intelligence on specific targets and recent events in the Soviet Ukraine and Soviet Union; also, the procurement of operational intelligence through the exploitation of the Ukrainian resistance movement.

B. Purpose

1. The purpose of this Amendment is to provide communications support for an additional operation (AERODYNAMIC/CAPACHO) not covered in the original annex.

C. Status

1. The Communications Annex for AERODYNAMIC, approved by AD/CO on 26 September 1952, remains in effect and communications support will continue for the presently authorized portions of the project. Two signal plans are currently active.

II. COMMUNICATIONS SUPPORT

The following support for this project will be required from the Office of Communications:

A. Circuits

1. A maximum of four (4) potential agent circuits working from the Western Ukraine to a CIA base station.

B. Equipment

1. A maximum of eight (8) agent radio sets.
2. A maximum of four (4) GN-58 hand generators.
3. A maximum of four (4) six volt, nickel-cadmium batteries or their equivalent.
4. Signal plans and cryptographic material for the above circuits.

C. Personnel

1. No addition to the present communications T/O will be required.

D. Training

1. The Office of Communications will be requested to train a maximum of eight (8) W/T operators.

III. SPECIAL COMMUNICATIONS CONSIDERATIONS

A. Communications training will be given in accordance with the instructions outlined in Office of Communications letter number CY-2-254, as amended by letter number CY-2-923 and OSO Field Regulation 10-5.

1. Basic and Intermediate Phases to be authorized only upon receipt of a provisional clearance, a full operational clearance or a waiver of these (Intermediate Phase to be authorized only upon satisfactory completion of the Basic Phase).

2. Advance Phase to be authorized only upon receipt of a full operational clearance or a waiver of same (and upon satisfactory completion of the Intermediate Phase).

B. Communications support for this project is subject to revision in view of changing requirements. However, changes necessitating an amendment to the basic plan will require a similar amendment to the Communication Annex.

C. Cover and other non-communications support will be provided by the SR Division for communications personnel assigned to this project.

D. Recruitment, administration and operational clearances of indigenous personnel will be the responsibility of SR Division.

IV. COMMUNICATIONS LOGISTIC SUPPORT

A. Personnel

No additional communications personnel will be required.

B. Equipment

All equipment will be supplied from existing communications stock.

C. Finance

The estimated cost to the Office of Communications for the support of this project is as follows:

1. Eight (8) agent radio sets (RS-1 or RS-6)
2. Four (4) GN-58 hand generators
3. Four (4) six volt, nickel-cadmium batteries
4. Cryptographic material

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D. Budget

This cost has been included in the Office of Communications Budget for Fiscal Year 1953.

V. IMPLEMENTATION AND ADMINISTRATION

A. Implementation of this support on the part of the Office of Communications will take place subsequent to receipt of written notice from SR Division of project approval by the appropriate approving authority.

B. Administration of the communications support for this project will be the responsibility of the Chief, EUCA in coordination with such other communications areas as may be required.
