GOLOBUTIV

1. In the village of HOLOBUTIV, near STRYI there is a ~~big~~ ^{large} military
airfield which extends as far as the village DULIBI. This is a ^{was} underground air-
field, and according to ~~information Subject received from local inhabitants,~~ ^{it}
~~is~~ ^{was} of extraordinary ^{large dimensions} great dimension. 2 years ago there was a sort of panic
among the airfield personnel, which ^{was} is composed exclusively of ^[Ethnic] Russians and
some Eastern Ukrainians. Arrests were made and some of the personnel were
sent out home. There was a rumor circulating in the area that someone from
among the personnel has "sold" plans of the airfield to Americans.

2. In the area of DELATYN, Stanislaw Oblast, in the direction
toward the mountains (Subject was unable to give more specific location)
a number of villages ^{had} have been resettled; the area was enclosed by wire
and a high fence. ~~People say that~~ There ^{was} is a rumor that manganese ore is
being mined there. ^{had} The local population who do not have ^{the} any access to ^{that}
area, could establish only ^{by the area} one fact that many trucks ~~x~~ filled with dirt come
out every day, ~~from that area~~ ^{from that area} unload the dirt and return empty. Subject
remarked "either they really mine something there or they build something
under ground". ~~Subject was not in that area herself; she only heard about it~~
from other people.

She also has heard that "Beyond Boryslav" (Drohobych area)

there is also such a denied area where villages have been resettled, the local
population has no access to it and something "secret is going on there".

The Soviets were alarmed after the U-2 was shot down. At that time there was a great movement of military and a very big mass of rocket transports and of other secret arms to the area of Dobromil, in the Carpathians on the Polish border.

In the large electric lamp factory in Lvov there is one department manned only by Russians, and they are strictly controlled.
