1. We appreciate the reference dispatch and the attachment thereto and are quite hopeful that further debriefing of Maria OKOLOOT will provide more positive intelligence and additional details on potential internal contacts. We will inform  when AECASSOWARY 29 is ready to return to  for further debriefing.

2. In response to the request in reference dispatch, we would like to make the following general remarks. AECASSOWARY 29 has been a REDSKIN FA under the control of a FOE/SOV case officer since early September, 1960. He has been primarily engaged since that time in establishing himself under unofficial cover and in creating a small group of spotters within the Ukrainian emigres in Germany using certain individuals such as AECASSOWARY 6, who are collaborators of AECASSOWARY 29's own organization. In this aspect of his activities we have found that AECASSOWARY 29 is a careful planner and is well founded in security and tradecraft. AECASSOWARY 29 does not seem to require a great deal of case officer support and has the ability to work under his own power and initiative. He is completely cooperative, albeit he has a basic loyalty to his own organization, and responds easily to KUBARK supervision and control. In operational administrative matters he has shown a high level of competence with the exception of reporting, which we are still emphasizing. In our discussions of various REDSKIN types of operations he has shown an ability to grasp and understand operational principles and purposes and an appreciation for KUBARK methods and procedures. We have not yet mounted an actual operation and therefore cannot judge how well he can apply theory to practice, but we expect that he will be able to conduct REDSKIN operations in a professional manner.

3. AECASSOWARY 29 has written up an assessment of AECASSOWARY 31 and his discussion with AECASSOWARY 31 and AECASSOWARY 34. We will forward these to  in a later dispatch. AECASSOWARY 29 reports from AECASSOWARY 34 that subject of FROB 8119 has not heard from his relatives in the Ukraine for over three months and is now afraid that something might have happened to them. For this reason he is unwilling to make a trip at this time. We hope that this situation may change before summer 1961 and that he might be persuaded to make a trip at a later date.

4. The undersigned, Identity 1, is the FOE/SOV case officer and works with AECASSOWARY 29 under the alias Identity 2.
