Additional Requirements for Debriefing AECASSOWARY/3's Mother

1. Three FI disseminations were made at Headquarters following analysis of the material forwarded in Reference. We received follow-up requirements from several sources within KURARK and from AECASSOWARY/1. Further information requested by KURARK is as follows:

A. Does Subject have any facts to substantiate her assertions regarding the necessity for using bribery to be matriculated by a medical faculty? Can she give details on student "protectors"? With the great emphasis on scientific training, is the cost of bribery higher for students in the scientific field than for those in other fields?

B. Ask Source to provide the full, formal name of the savings bank for which she worked. Can she provide a full roster of employees with their exact duties and home addresses? She should discuss hiring, firing and other personnel policies. What is the administrative subordination of the bank, from the highest level on down? Give full titles and addresses of each of these organs and the names of their directors. Describe the bank's activities in detail, including accounting and reporting procedures and relations with other local organizations. Describe procedure for depositing and withdrawing money. What forms or account books are used? Describe security measures at the bank. Who is responsible for instituting and maintaining security? What checks are made?

2. The following questions were provided by AECASSOWARY/2:

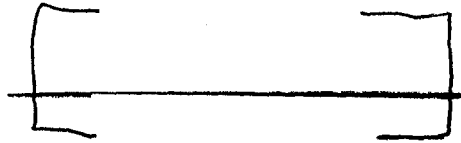
- A. What does Source know about the death of Roman Shukhevych?
- B. What does she know about the death and funeral of Mykola Duzhyi in Lviv, 1957?
- C. What is known about the high school teacher Bilankyi from Lviv?
- D. Lev Dolymaky: What is known about his brothers Petro and Stepan and his sister? What has happened to them? They were deported with their father in 1941.
- E. What has happened to the two brothers Dunay from Peremyshli? One was employed by the Zahaykevych law firm.
- F. What is known by Source about Kuk's and Matvlyeyko's open letters?
- G. Did Source visit the museums of Lviv? Who from among her acquaintances works there?
- H. Does Source know anything about Mrs. PAVENTRKA-HORBOVA, who allegedly works at the Lviv University Library?
- I. What talk and comments did people make in Lviv in connection with the Oberlander and Nachtigal affair? What paper did Source read?
- J. What is the population's reaction to press attacks on the emigration and particularly on personalities? What was the reaction to Bandera's death?
- K. Where and when do people meet in Lviv (church, theater, concerts, market)?
- L. Does a visit of a stranger in somebody's house arouse suspicion?
- M. Who behaves most freely--intelligentsia, workers, Ukrainians from the East, Poles?
- N. Give the names of the priests in the churches of Lviv and their background. Which church did Source attend?
- O. Does Source know Mrs. Horbachevskis, the Zarytsky family and other teachers and university professors? Give details.
- P. Does she know any post office employees in Lviv from among the local population?
- Q. What physicians are known to her (names, addresses, hospitals, characteristics)?
- R. What is the attitude of individuals toward money? How much does it mean to them generally?
- S. Does Source know any local Ukrainian girls who work as secretaries in government offices?
- T. Did Source know any of the Basilian nuns in Lviv?

3. All of the names of internal contacts provided by Source have been carded. We find one particularly interesting: the subject of paragraph 4d on page 4 of the debriefing. Until AECASSOWARY/37's trip was cancelled, we had considered possible exploitation of this lead in some way by AECASSOWARY/37

in view of their common interest in painting. Others of special interest are the subjects of paragraphs 4e, 4g and 4o. The remainder we are less able to evaluate. It is suggested that in his re-debriefing of Source, ABCASSOWARY/29 ask her which of her friends and acquaintances would be most likely to respond to a call for action on behalf of the Ukraine and against the Soviet regime, as well as to which ones she might agree to pen a letter of introduction to be used by some trusted visitor from the West in the future. All information which Source has on these people should be drawn from her. We are most interested in any suggestions or plans either FOB or Stockholm might have with regard to operational follow-up on any of these operational leads. ABCASSOWARY/15 is currently mounting a REDSKIN operation, the primary mission of which will be internal contact. (Gathering of PI will be secondary.) Several other travellers are being lined up to follow during the summer. If source's leads are substantial enough, we might consider building contact with one or more of these leads into these operations. It is requested that the field design its REDSKIN operations with the same contact possibilities in mind. We would like to strive for an eventual operational collaboration in which Headquarters and field ABCASSOWARY/1 REDSKIN operations are closely coordinated, with travellers from both areas participating in various aspects of the same internal contact operations where appropriate. Such a collaboration would provide us with highly desirable flexibility in our timing and approach. The areas in which we currently have potential internal recruits is Lvov (or Lviv, as Ukrainians prefer). This is not surprising, as Lvov continues to be the Mecca of Ukrainian nationalism and many Western Ukrainians have friends and family there.
