1. By his letter dtd 22 Feb 1963 SHANKOVSKY Ihor (Sh) informed Uncle that on 21 or 22 Feb 1963 he met accidentally at the GIMBELS DEPT STORE, Coats Dept on the 3-rd Floor, in PHILADELPHIA, GANZUK (GANDZIUK) /G/ who came there to buy a fur-coat for his wife in KIEV. Sh. is employed with GIMBELS, Coats Dept., Tel. WA 2-3300, Buyers Office, Ext. 2078, 3rd Floor Ext. 2079, as "Assistant Buyer" since 8 months.

G spoke broken English and S asked him about his accent. G explained that it was Russian and followingly Sh switched over to the same asking G where he was coming from. G replied that he arrived from KIEV. Sh started to talk in Ukrainian and said that as far as he knew KIEV belonged to the Ukraine. G seemed to be very glad to hear Sh speak his native language and they continued their conversation in Ukrainian. Sh introduced himself as a Ukrainian from LVOV. G told Sh that he was a student at the University of Penna and arrived to the States together with another Ukrainian student on 29 Jan 1963. G's colleague went, however, to Princeton University.

Sh tried to help G in finding a suitable fur-coat for latter's wife but without success. Sh asked G to come eventually next Saturday again hoping to procure in the meantime something nice for G's wife. G agreed gladly to but unfortunately SH was unable to get what G wanted and the latter bought no fur-coat at all.

To Sh his new acquaintance looked very sympathetic from the very beginning of their encounter and Sh asked him for a cup of coffee and ice-cream. G gladly accepted Sh's invitation and they spoke for about half-an-hour. By his general remarks G. impressed Sh as an honest and conscious Ukrainian and finally they parted as friends intending to see each other more often in the future.

2. About his encounter with G., Sh informed by telephone his father SHANKOVSKY, Lev and asked for advice. According to what Sh Ihor told Peter - Sh, sen. told his son to

G asked Sh to accompany him to New York and eventually to introduce to some good Ukrainian emigrees there.

6. On 28 Feb 1963 Sh told Peter that recently when he was driving in his car together with G, in Philadelphia, he was given a summons notice by policemen for speeding up. G felt "very offended" at the policemen stopping them and protested very strongly, pointing out that he was a Soviet student.

7. Sh has his own car which he bought at \$ 150.- and a driver's license on his name issued in Philadelphia.

8. Sh promised PROCYK to contact him with G and Yura. The latter is SHESTAK Yuri of Princeton, see previous report/.

PROCYK was instructed by us to disentangle himself from Sh and try to get closer look at both Soviet students. It was planned that after introduction PROCYK will insulate himself in a proper way from Sh and will eventually drive G to New York and later to Princeton by himself. PROCYK will also invite G and later Yura to his house in Philadelphia in order to cultivate further contacts and collect material for their assessment.
