...replying to a letter of June 15  
from the Soviet central committee.

We will never take part in any inter-  
national meeting or any preparatory  
meeting for it, which you call for the  
purpose of "splitting the international  
communist movement" was one of the  
phrases in the Chinese letter. Another  
was: "We firmly believe that the day  
your so-called meeting takes place will  
be the day you step into your grave."

The Chinese letter, dated July 29, and  
published by New China news agency  
though, seemed to observers to be an  
open challenge to the Soviet leaders to  
acknowledge a split in the world com-  
munist movement. It showed the  
Chinese leaders as completely convinced  
that they have Mr. Baruch's support on the  
one hand and are determined to press home  
their attempt to take over the leadership  
of world communism.

### ILLEGAL MOVE

The Chinese letter was divided into  
five parts and ran to 12,000 Chinese  
characters. It said that the Soviet Com-  
munist Party, in the letter of June 15,  
laid down "a directive organization and  
line for an international congress of  
the fraternal parties."

This shows that you are determined to  
prepare and call such a meeting arbit-  
rarily, unilaterally and illegally with the  
aim of effecting an open split in the inter-  
national communist movement. If you  
want to convene a party assembly for a  
split, rather it should be called a minor  
schismatic gathering.

The letter said that there were some  
parties which "abandoned obediently in  
response to your appeal and their number  
is dwindling."

Since you have prepared to call a  
meeting, you will be prepared to discuss

### CHINESE CONSISTENCY

If you do not call the meeting, people  
will say that you have followed the advice  
of the Chinese and the fraternal  
parties and will not be able to do  
call the meeting, you will lead the world  
in an impasse without any end. But  
the present historical situation this is a  
grave crisis for you, a crisis of your  
own making.

The Chinese letter charged the Soviet  
that the Chinese had made a volte  
face in first agreeing to the call of inter-  
national Communist Party and subse-  
quently opposing it. It said the Chinese  
position had changed since that a  
conference of this kind should be very  
carefully prepared and there should  
be no hurried conference or attempt to  
split the international communist move-  
ment.

It was the Soviet Party that had made a  
volte face and was trying to prepare and  
convene an international conference in  
a blitzkrieg-like manner. On February  
of this year China had accepted first a  
resumption of bilateral talks between the  
Chinese and Soviet Communist Parties  
(including the parties of Cuba, Japan, Italy  
and France).

### ALLIANCE WITH U.S.

The letter accused the Soviet Party of  
having in February sent a letter directed  
against the Chinese party of fraternal  
parties in a plot to take collective  
measures against the Chinese.

with the United States ruling clique

with United States imperialism to carve up  
the world and oppose the revolutionary  
struggles of the people of all countries.

The letter referred more than once to  
the Soviet Communist Party having the  
"balcon" and said it regarded all the  
fraternal parties as puppets qualified to  
move only at your command. It said  
that such puppets were permeated with  
the spirit of great-power chauvinism and  
of a patriarchal father party.

It strongly reiterated charges that the  
present programme of the Soviet Com-  
munist Party was "revisionist" and were  
the twentieth and twenty-second congresses  
of the Soviet Party in 1956 and 1961. It  
said that these two congresses, the first of  
which denounced Stalin and declared there  
was more than one road to socialism were  
the root causes of the present divisions  
within the international communist move-  
ment.

### ROAD TO DOOM

It also declared it was the Soviet party,  
not the Chinese which had begun the pole-  
mic and "kindled the fire." It said that  
the number of communists in the world  
who really believed in revisionism was only  
a small fraction and they were bound to  
collapse in the end.

The letter concluded with an appeal  
addressed to "Dear Comrades" which  
said: "Once again we sincerely advise you  
to remain on the brink of the precipice and  
not to partze such time and useless face-  
saying. But if you refuse to listen and are  
determined to take the road to doom, well,  
suit yourselves." —Reuter.

### RUSSIA ACCUSED OF ANTI-SEMITISM

GENEVA, July 30.—Israel today accused  
the Soviet Union of conducting a campaign  
of "racial assimilation" against the  
three million Jews living there with the  
aim of eliminating the Jewish national  
identity. Without mentioning the Soviet  
Union, the Israel delegate to the United  
Nations Economic and Social Council, Mr.  
M. Bartur, expressed "deepest anxiety" at  
the situation of the largest Jewish com-  
munity in Europe. The council was dis-  
cussing the report of the United Nations  
committee on human rights.

Mr. Bartur said anti-Semitism existed  
all over the world but in no country was  
it supported by official editors and pub-  
lishers. He quoted several allegedly anti-  
Semitic books published recently in the  
Soviet Union, but was interrupted by the  
Soviet delegate, Mr. V. N. Mendryshev,  
who accused him of making slanderous  
remarks and holding up the work of the  
council.

Mr. Mendryshev strongly rejected the  
Israel statement, and said that at the  
moment there were 92 synagogues in the  
Soviet Union. Mr. Bartur replied that  
according to Soviet statistics presented to  
the United Nations, in 1956 there had been  
450 synagogues in the Soviet Union.

### NEW MOSCOW RADIO SERVICE

Moscow Radio will introduce a 24-hour  
continuous service of news, comments, and  
music for its home listeners from August 1,  
according to the latest issue of *Radio  
Pravda* (radio programme), published  
in Moscow. This will be called the Mayak  
(lighthouse) services and will be broadcast on  
short, long and medium waves, thus  
making it audible all over the Soviet Union  
and in many parts of the outside world,  
the magazine declared.

Mayak replaces the Moscow Radio home  
service's second programme which could  
not be heard throughout the Soviet Union  
and abroad because it was broadcast only  
on long and medium waves. It will also
