Project AERODYNAMIC. AECASSOWARY/29 from. a young American citizen of Ukrainian parentage who travelled to various cities in the Soviet Union during 1963 as a guide with a United States technical exhibit.

DATE ACQUIRED: August 1964

The source was told by two Soviet citizens with whom she spoke in Alma-Ata in late 1963 that in late 1962 or early 1963, as a result of discontent with poor living and working conditions in an area near Alma-Ata, a group of about 10,000 non-Kazakh Soviet citizens who had been sent to Kazakhstan to work organized a strike and began a protest march to Alma-Ata. They were stopped en route by military troops, forced into a nearby ravine and machine gunned to death. The source could supply no other information about this incident.

- 2. If the above information is disseminated, the source may be described as an American citizen, an untested, probably reliable source, who visited in the Soviet Union for a period of several weeks in late 1963.
