10. ACTION REPORTED								
A. <u>By Headquarters:</u>								
<p>1. In connection with the transfer of Project AERODYNAMIC from SR/PP to SR/3 as earlier reported, C J has been assigned as case officer and will conduct necessary liaison with other elements of SR Division, such as SR/7 which has an operational interest in the project. On the PP aspects of the project, the case officer will be working closely with a senior SR/3 PP officer.</p> <p>2. During this period, operations of AERODYNAMIC have continued as before. Vol. I, No. 3 of the Prolog Magazine in the English language was completed and is now being distributed to libraries and embassies throughout the world, and to people interested in using the magazine as source material for leaflets and radio programs.</p> <p>3. The "Information Bulletin" No. 7-F (combined issue for August-September) has been completed and distributed. Additional letters from the Soviet Union have been received, some in favor, and some violently abusive. PYREX radio tapes are being prepared as usual and are now being broadcast on a schedule which doubles their previous air time. PP materials for the preparation of Ukrainian broadcasts at Radio Nacional were also prepared and submitted during this period.</p> <p>4. AERODYNAMIC, through its branch office in Munich and its contacts in other European cities, has begun a program of sending Ukrainian books to Polish and Ukrainian scholars in Polish universities (e.g., Lublin, Warsaw, Wroclaw, and Danzig). They have received acknowledgements from all these universities and requests for further books, especially the "Ukrainian Encyclopedia." In some cases they have received books in exchange. AERODYNAMIC funds for book distribution are limited due to the budget cut, and they have inquired whether it would be possible to obtain additional help in this project. The books are being sent to those areas of Poland in close proximity to the borders of the Ukraine and to areas where there are large settlements of Ukrainians. We have been informed that there is considerable contact between the Ukrainians in Poland and the Ukrainians in the Ukrainian SSR and that many of these books are being brought into the Ukrainian SSR. In many cases, scholars from the Ukrainian SSR traveling or studying in Poland also make use of those Ukrainian books located in Polish universities.</p>

5. In July 1957, the ABNEEMIVE group helped finance a German-Ukrainian journalist's visit to the Moscow Youth Festival. The journalist returned with a long report on her contacts primarily with young people from the Ukraine. This report has been submitted to SR/PP and other interested offices.

6. [ ] who is taking over PP guidance of Project AERODYNAMIC from [ ] , was introduced by the latter to AEGASSOWARY 2 on 21 September 1957.

B. By the Field:

1. AEGASSOWARY-3, principal agent of the Munich Branch Office of ABNEEMIVE, arrived in the United States on 4 September for a two month visit in connection with the 25th anniversary of his service in the Ukrainian Catholic priesthood. On 17 September, meetings were held in Washington with him and AEGASSOWARY-2 to discuss the effect of the reorganization of Project AERODYNAMIC in the field activities. Since funds relayed to the field are now strictly subsidy funds for the two newspapers, AEGASSOWARY-3 suggested that some additional funds be relayed for such operations activities as are necessary in the field, e.g. travel, entertainment funds for contacts, and funds to build up a small library of books which could be relayed to visiting Soviet and Satellite delegations. AEGASSOWARY-3 envisioned no major problems re the reorganization which had been carried out in the field by combining the two printing plants and changing one newspaper into a monthly.

2. Due to the reduced newspaper subsidy under the budget cut, the newspaper "Ukrainsky Samostiynik" became a monthly in journal form as of 1 September 1957 and began utilizing the same printing facilities as those used by the other newspaper "Sushasna Ukraina" in order to cut costs.
